

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY DECISION. City of Pittsburg, 200 Rusk Street, Pittsburg, Texas 75686 has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for a renewal of Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) Permit No. WQ0010250001, which authorizes the discharge of treated domestic wastewater at an annual average flow not to exceed 2,000,000 gallons per day. TCEQ received this application on August 4, 2020.

The facility is located on Sparks Branch between Farm-to-Market Road 557 and State Highway 11, approximately 1.25 miles east of the intersection of Farm-to-Market Road 557 and State Highway Loop 271, in Camp County, Texas 75686. The treated effluent is discharged to Sparks Branch, thence to Dry Creek, thence to Big Cypress Creek Below Lake Bob Sandlin in Segment No. 0404 of the Cypress Creek Basin. The unclassified receiving water use is intermediate aquatic life use for Sparks Branch and Dry Creek. The designated uses for Segment No. 0404 are primary contact recreation and intermediate aquatic life use. The TCEQ Executive Director has completed the technical review of the application and prepared a draft permit. The draft permit, if approved, would establish the conditions under which the facility must operate. The Executive Director has made a preliminary decision that this permit, if issued, meets all statutory and regulatory requirements. The permit application, Executive Director's preliminary decision, and draft permit are available for viewing and copying at Pittsburg City Hall, 200 Rusk Street, Pittsburg, Texas.

PUBLIC COMMENT / PUBLIC MEETING. You may submit public comments or request a public meeting about this application. The purpose of a public meeting is to provide the opportunity to submit comments or to ask questions about the application. TCEQ holds a public meeting if the Executive Director determines that there is a significant degree of public interest in the application or if requested by a local legislator. A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. After the deadline for submitting public comments, the Executive Director will consider all timely comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. **Unless the application is directly referred for a contested case hearing, the response to comments will be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments and to those persons who are on the mailing list for this application. If comments are received, the mailing will also provide instructions for requesting a contested case hearing or reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision.** A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in a state district court.

TO REQUEST A CONTESTED CASE HEARING, YOU MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN YOUR REQUEST: your name, address, phone number; applicant's name and proposed permit number; the location and distance of your property/activities relative to the proposed facility; a specific description of how you would be adversely affected by the facility in a way not common to the general public; a list of all disputed issues of fact that you submit during the comment period; and the statement "[I/we] request a contested case hearing." If the request for contested case hearing is filed on behalf of a group or association, the request must designate the group's representative for receiving future correspondence; identify by name and physical address an individual member of the group who would be adversely affected by the proposed facility or activity; provide the information discussed above regarding the affected member's location and distance from the facility or activity; explain how and why the member would be affected; and explain how the interests the group seeks to protect are relevant to the group's purpose.

Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the Executive Director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The Executive Director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the Executive Director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the Executive Director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk. In addition, you may request to be placed on: (1) the permanent mailing list for a specific applicant name and permit number; and/or (2) the mailing list for a specific county. If you wish to be placed on the permanent and/or the county mailing list, clearly specify which list(s) and send your request to TCEQ Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

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

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True island green may create more drama

RANCHO MIRAGE, Calif. – The ANA Inspiration celebrates its 50th anniversary this week, and the 18th green has gone retro.

No grandstand.
No Great Wall of Dinah.
Just an island of drama.
Or will it be?

“I honestly find it a bit boring,” said Madelene Sagstrom, who believes not many will go for the green in two, even with a forward tee. Tournament officials typically move the tee up on two days during the ANA Inspiration.

Mel Reid will likely go for it with a 5-iron in hand because she’s that kind of aggressive player, but she too believes fewer players will take on the risk with greens as firm as they are and the grass mowed down in the back and nothing there to stop it. Not to mention the yellow hazard stakes.

For years there has been typically a grandstand behind the green for VIP hospitality. With no fans at last September’s ANA, organizers opted to instead put up a giant blue wall – closer than the grandstands usually sit – with ANA scripted in small letters across the top. As far as billboards go, it wasn’t exactly effective.

Not surprisingly, the wall came into play in a big way when Mirim Lee rocketed a 5-wood at it, banking on the wall to stop her ball from going in the water. It worked, and Lee proceeded to chip for eagle to make her way into a playoff against Brooke Henderson and Nelly Korda that Lee quickly won. Henderson’s second shot in regulation got stuck under the wall and her sister/caddie Brittany crawled inside the blue mesh to retrieve it.

“The amount of time the boys hit it into grandstands and get away with shots and bounce onto greens,” said Reid, “and then they just made a big fuss because we didn’t have any crowds. I mean, it’s been like that for years. I don’t think they needed to change it, but I get why they have because it does look a little bit stupid with no crowd, but it’s tough.”

Stacy Lewis, a past champion of this event, appreciates that the hole now plays as it was originally designed. (It’s also played this way during the first stage of LPGA Q-School.) Lewis never goes for this green in

two though, so nothing really changes for her.

“I hit 5-iron yesterday, landed in the middle of the green and went over in the water,” said Ryann O’Toole.

The same thing happened to Jennifer Kupcho with a 4-iron.

Nelly Korda hit a 6-iron just short and it rolled into the middle of the green. Her 5-iron went over the green. Korda said she was undecided on whether or not she likes the change.

Last year, Lexi Thompson had a 7-iron in from the forward tee to a back pin. That’s the shortest she has seen it play. Tuesday morning, Thompson hit a 4-iron that worked out quite nicely. If it’s more than a 6-iron though, Thompson said she likely won’t go for it in competition. “It would have to be a perfect number honestly, with any club, to get the full max height to be able to stop it,” she said. “But it’s good, it’s a major. It should be challenging and require more thought.”

Brooke Henderson said it’s no longer an automatic green light with 3-wood in hand, but if she has hybrid or 7-wood in, she’ll definitely going for it.

If Maria Fassi finds the fairway, she’ll likely go for it. From the back tee on Monday, she hit 5-iron with a helping wind onto the green. On Tuesday, she hit 7-iron from the forward tee.

“It makes you think a little bit more,” said Fassi. “It demands a better golf shot as well. I think it’s fun.”

Yani Tseng, the 2010 ANA winner, believes the raw island green makes for a great finish: “This is real golf.”

To ensure more drama over the weekend, Katherine Kirk believes softening the green more is the answer.

Sue Witters, LPGA vice president of rules and competition, said they have already started adding water to the greens after Monday played particularly firm.

“The greens got firm on us yesterday,” Witters said on Tuesday.

With temperatures expected to reach 99 degrees over the weekend, players expect the Dinah Shore Tournament Course to get more baked out as the week goes on.

World Golf Hall of Famer Judy Rankin, lead analyst for Golf Channel this week, likes to see the most iconic hole on the LPGA return to its original form. This is how the closing par 5 played when she won in 1976.

“You have find a way to reward a shot that’s well-struck,” Rankin said of making sure that the green is receptive throughout the week.

No, baseball remains plenty conservative. And it is clear its more rigorous embrace of social justice initiatives in the past year are not only on the right side of history but also, simply, good business.

Consider the “corporate champions” standing alongside MLB in its rebuke of Georgia’s voting laws: Delta, Coca-Cola, American Airlines, JPMorgan Chase, Citigroup.

Not exactly Ben & Jerry’s and Patagonia.

As the corporate “mob” grows in voicing its disapproval, it becomes easier to understand how Manfred’s at the time stunning decision to move the game out of Georgia was executed swiftly and unilaterally.

So the game found a new home in Denver, and the league readied for the triggered indignation of the right, and now, nearly a week out, it is clear the blowback is nothing MLB can’t handle.

The national GOP? Reduced largely to Red-Baiting 101 and a silly conflation of ticket purchasing and voting rights, even as defections in its ranks rise.

Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell? He issued a “warning to corporate America to stay out of politics,” yet immediately begged they continue giving money, you know, to him.

The unofficial mainstream media arm of the right?

The furor will subside, and any notion of the game ever existing in Atlanta may drown in a chorus of oohs and ahhs from a Home Run Derby held at mile-high Coors Field.

Baseball survived through a half-century where it first barred Black players from the game, then faced blowback and boycotts and threats when it dared

allow Jackie Robinson to play. It survived Jose Feliciano’s national anthem, a no-hitter thrown under the influence of hallucinogenics and the designated hitter.

times he played the Masters.

He is a sentimental choice. So too is Rory McIlroy, who has never won a Masters and is observing an anniversary he would like to forget. It has been 10 years since his final-round collapse in 2011 that led to a disastrous 80. A decade later, will it finally be his turn?

There’s sentiment. Then there’s science. Which brings us back to DeChambeau. As he looked ahead to this week, the game’s mad scientist was also musing about the future.

“I think as time goes on, there’s not much more to gain from the technology side of golf club manufacturing,” he said. “There are little things we can do, but where the massive gains will be is in athletes. Once you get somebody out here that’s a 7-foot-tall human being and they are able to swing a golf club at 145 miles an hour effortlessly, that’s when things get a little interesting. That’s when I’m going to become obsolete potentially even.”

That day is not this week, or anytime soon. Right now, DeChambeau is on top of his game, and that should be good enough to win this tournament. If he’s going down rabbit holes, we should definitely follow him.

The famed golfer broke bones in his right leg during the crash Feb. 23 in Rolling Hills Estates, south of downtown Los Angeles. He had surgery and announced on Twitter on March 16 that he was recovering from his home in Florida after being released from the hospital.

Forensic car crash reconstruction experts contacted by USA TODAY Sports said the available evidence from the crash was consistent with Woods being unconscious from the time he lost control until the time of impact.

One of those experts is Jonathan Cherny, a former police detective who walked the scene after the crash but is not involved in the investigation. He previously said it was “like a classic case of falling asleep behind the wheel, because the road curves and his vehicle goes straight.” After hearing the evidence presented Wednesday, Cherny said he stands by that opinion 100%.

Instead of staying with his downhill lane as it curved right, Woods kept going left, struck the 8-inch curb of the median, hit a large wooden sign, kept going through the median, then went into opposing traffic lanes and off the road before going through extensive vegetation, hitting a tree and rolling over.

His vehicle traveled an estimated 400 feet after leaving his lane and hitting the median. If he had been conscious, the theory is that there would be some evidence of braking or significant steering, the experts said. There were no skid marks on the road, Villanueva said. Even with anti-lock brakes, experts said there could be faint skid marks. After striking a curb and hitting a large sign in the median, the theory is that a driver would try to correct the error and get out of the emergency by driving back onto the road and braking.

Woods, 45, instead kept going and going in a fairly straight direction with his no braking. He then told first responders that he didn’t remember how the accident occurred and didn’t re-

member driving.

Data from the black box recorder showed some minimal steering. But Powers said it wasn’t clear “if it was him trying to correct the situation or if it was the impact to the vehicle at the areas of impact” that caused the steering movement and not Woods. The collision sequence involved multiple impacts, starting with the curb of the center divider, a wooden sign, another curb on the other side of the road and a tree.

The sheriff’s department also did not seek blood evidence from him, saying he appeared lucid at the scene of the crash and that there were no signs of impairment to warrant a blood examination.

Powers said investigators interviewed Woods at the scene and at the hospital.

“The questions were asked, and there was nothing to indicate any type of intoxication,” Powers said. “He did answer those questions. He stated he didn’t

drink. There was nothing. He wasn’t taking any medication.”

Villanueva first stressed that the crash was “purely an accident,” while his department also emphasized that the road Woods had been driving on was known for accidents and speeding.

To learn more about what happened, the sheriff’s department then executed a search warrant to obtain the data from the vehicle’s black box, which typically shows speed, steering and braking activity before impact.

After obtaining the data, Villanueva offered some clarification on March 17 when he said there were no “obvious” signs of impairment. He then went on to talk about “lessons learned” and said, “I can tell you this: We do need more drug recognition experts within the department.”

Drug recognition experts (DRE) are law enforcement officers trained to recognize signs of impairment that are not obvious. After a crash, they go through a 12-step process to evaluate a driver for impairment and can request a blood examination. No DRE was used in the Woods case because Villanueva said then that it wasn’t necessary.

“We can’t just assume that somebody’s history makes them guilty,” sheriff’s Deputy John Schloegl told USA TODAY Sports on March 2.

In 2009, Woods was cited for careless driving after crashing into a tree and fire hydrant outside his mansion in Florida. He was found unconscious at the scene and a witness then said Woods had been prescribed the sleep medication Ambien and the painkiller Vicodin, according to a police report.

In 2017, he was found asleep at the wheel in Florida and arrested for drunken driving. A toxicology report showed he had Ambien, Vicodin, THC and other medications in his system. He checked into a clinic after that to get help dealing with medication for pain and a sleep disorder. He pleaded guilty to reckless driving.

On Wednesday, Villanueva again stressed that Woods received no special treatment from his department. Powers said the reason Woods was not issued a citation was because there were no independent witnesses to the crash and “no observations by a peace officer which would support the issuance of a citation.”




