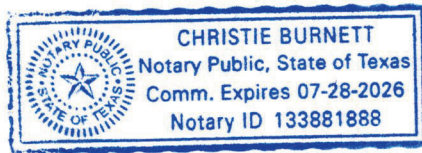

Brabon was the prayer leader for what was perhaps the greatest campus revival in American history, in February 1970.

Prayers were answered again this past February, as Jesus moved in similar power. In two weeks, the Holy Spirit's presence was once again felt at Asbury campus of some 1,600 students, while 50,000 people representing 50 countries came seeking to join in what God was doing. Among them were students from 284 colleges who came seeking revival for their own campuses.

In *The Coming Tsunami*, Dr. Jim Denison states: "As earthquakes hundreds of miles away from any shore can result in a singular, sweeping tsunami that plunges a country's coastline into chaos, so, too can long-past cultural upheavals threaten to drown Christianity."

As Dr. Denison reminds us, revivals always begin with prayers of power with these characteristics:

- **Our prayers must be passionate.** The time has passed for believers to waffle in our convictions. The only safe space is all in for Christ.
  - **Our prayers must be specific.** What many people enjoy about Denison Forum is that it applies biblical truth to real-world situations. Our prayers must do the same, crying out for God's intervention in specific ways in our culture.
  - **Our prayers must be continual.** Like the persistent widow in Luke 18, you and I must "always pray and never give up" (v. 1).
  - **Our prayers must be collective.** One of my own prayers for Denison Forum is that it encourages Christians to know they're not alone. We stand together in our love for God and heart for his kingdom. Our prayers must reflect the same unity.
- These prayers move the heart of God while shattering enemy strongholds. There's no doubt evil prevails in our world. As Christians we are not called to run away. Instead, as Christians we were given a mandate from

Christ to confront evil.

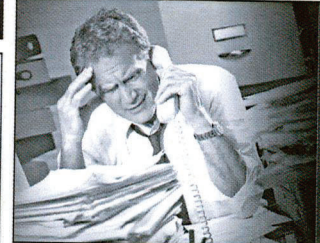

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has made available for public comment on the Recreational Use Attainability Analysis for Big Cypress Creek (0405A) in the Cypress Creek River Basin, within Hopkins, Wood, and Franklin counties and Recreational Use Attainability Analysis for Lilly Creek (0409A) in the Cypress Creek River Basin, within Upshur and Camp counties.

A use-attainability analysis (UAA) evaluates designated or presumed uses if there is reason to believe the standards for a water body are inappropriate due to local conditions. A Recreational Use-Attainability Analysis (RUAA) is a specific type of UAA that is conducted to evaluate and determine what category of recreational use is appropriate for a particular water body. RUAAs are typically site-specific studies that assess reasonably attainable recreational uses based on the physical and flow characteristics of a stream—such as water depth and persistence of flow.

Supporting information, including surveys of individuals and organizations with firsthand knowledge of a water body, is also collected to assess historical and existing patterns of recreational use.

If you would like to comment on the reports or have information on current or past recreation activities occurring on these water bodies, comments will be accepted until September 15, 2023. Please reference RUAA Big Cypress Creek and/or RUAA Lilly Creek with submitted comments. TCEQ will not issue a formal response to comments at this stage.

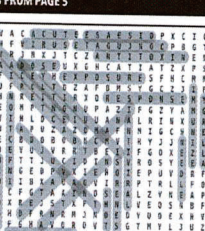

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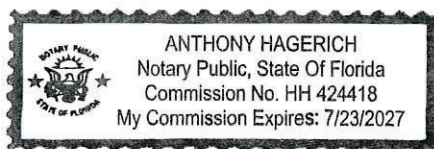

## MLB TRADE DEADLINE WINNERS AND LOSERS

## Astros get big lift; Mets burned it all down

There were contending baseball teams that used Tuesday's trade deadline to augment their chances of reaching the promised land. There were contenders that used the deadline to instead become pretenders. And there were teams that still don't have the slightest idea whether they're a contender or a pretender.

Then there are the Houston Astros and the New York Mets. The teams that symbolized the winners and losers of the trade deadline.

You thought the Astros, the defending World Series champions, were going to sit idly by and watch the Texas Rangers and Los Angeles Angels load up? Then, you don't know owner Jim Crane.

Crane, who has turned his franchise into a powerful juggernaut, winning four American League pennants and two World Series titles the last six years, wants to make sure their championship window isn't ready to close yet.

The Astros engineered the blockbuster of the trade deadline, bringing back future Hall of Fame pitcher Justin Verlander from the Mets for two of their top prospects and having the Mets chip in a cool \$53 million, too.

It wasn't a trade. It was a heist. Oh, sure, it cost the Astros prospects Drew Gilbert and Ryan Clifford, but in return they get Verlander, who has been dominating the National League, yielding a 1.95 ERA in his past nine starts and with a 3.15 ERA this season.

So the Astros passed on matching the two-year, \$86.6 million contract with a \$35 million vesting option the Mets gave Verlander in the offseason and now are getting him for less than half price. The Mets are paying \$35 million of the \$54 million Verlander is owed through 2024. If his \$35 million option is exercised, which becomes automatically vested with 140 innings pitched, they'll chip in another \$17.5 million. It means the Astros are paying just \$40.5 million to have Verlander's services for two-plus seasons.

No wonder the Astros could barely contain their euphoria with the news, wanting to break out champagne before they even took the field before their game against the Cleveland Guardians.

"I feel like it's opening day today," Astros third baseman Alex Bregman said pregame. "It's definitely going to provide a huge boost, not only energy-wise, but also to be able to have a guy like him in here."

A few hours later, Framber Valdez threw the season's third no-hitter and the 16th in franchise history, a 2-0 win at Minute Maid Park.

While the Astros were ready to party, the Mets were preparing for a funeral.

Their season is over.

Not just this season, but next year too — and perhaps even 2025.

Max Scherzer, who was traded to the Rangers over the weekend, revealed Tuesday that he waived his no-trade clause after being informed by Mets owner Steve Cohen and general manager Billy Eppler that the franchise does not expect to contend again for a few years.

"The math changed on them," Scherzer said at his press conference. "I asked kind of what's going on, and (Eppler's) answer was he's now shifting vision and they're looking to compete now for 2025 and 2026 — 2024, it was not going to be a reload situation in New York."

The Mets, who also traded outfielders Tommy Pham to the Arizona Diamondbacks, Mark Canha to the Milwaukee Brewers and closer David Robertson to the Miami Marlins, will now spend the winter dumping even more contracts.

The Mets could shop All-Star first

baseman Pete Alonso and virtually everyone else with big contracts and will listen to any and all offers, even including All-Star closer Edwin Diaz and shortstop Francisco Lindor.

They have already spent more than \$100 million just buying prospects in their sell-off, so they certainly don't intend to stop now. They have collected eight of their top 24 prospects in trades this past week and have done a 180, spending nearly \$500 million in payroll and taxes to try to buy a championship to now buying a farm system.

"You have to go through a little pain to get where we want to go," Eppler said. "Our organization is making strides for a better future. ... We want to make the best out of the circumstances."

They spent more money than any other team in baseball history, but four months later the team's plans to be a World Series champion in five years went into foreclosure.

If nothing else, it's Cohen's rude awakening to the baseball business.

Here's a look at the rest of the winners and losers from the trade deadline.

## Winners

## Los Angeles Angels

Well, now that the Mets would seem to be out of the running for Shohei Ohtani and the San Diego Padres are still stuck with all of their bloated contracts for their bunch of underachievers, the Angels have a better chance than ever to retain Ohtani. They traded away their top prospects for a starter (Lucas Giolito), reliever (Reynaldo Lopez), first baseman (C.J. Cron) and outfielder (Randal Grichuk) and now are squarely in the hunt for their first postseason berth since 2014. Even if they don't make the playoffs, Ohtani can at least see they're trying, and why leave when he's seeing first-hand that money can't guarantee even a winning record? The trade deadline eliminated a few of Ohtani's suitors in one glorious afternoon.

## Texas Rangers

The Rangers spent \$700 million in free agency the past two years, then went big in the trade market. They grabbed Jordan Montgomery and Chris Stratton from the St. Louis Cardinals, Scherzer from the Mets, and catcher Austin Hedges from the Pittsburgh Pirates to help replace injured All-Star Jonah Heim. Just like that, they are serious heavyweight contenders, trying to go where they haven't been since 2011 when they were one strike away from winning the World Series. Who knew the epicenter of MLB's powerhouses would be deep in the heart of Texas.

## Baltimore Orioles

A year ago, they traded away popular outfielder Trey Mancini to Houston and All-Star closer Jorge Lopez to the Minnesota Twins, with GM Mike Elias saying their team might be good enough to reach the postseason but didn't believe they could make it out of the wild-card round. This time, with the Orioles sitting in first place in the AL East, he didn't flinch, trading away prospects for Cardinals starter Jack Flaherty. He'll look good pitching in October.

## Miami Marlins

The Marlins are hanging on for dear life in the NL wild-card race and have struggled for a month, but they refuse to look ahead to next year. They want to win right now. So they acquired power hitters Jake Burger from the Chicago White Sox and Josh Bell of the Cleveland Guardians as well as pitcher Ryan Weathers from San Diego. It's rather refreshing to see a team whose odds to reach the postseason is only at 45%, according to FanGraphs, but still pushed their chips all-in.

## Arizona Diamondbacks

They have played awful baseball the past month (8-16), sinking in the standings from first place in the NL West to sitting just outside of the wild-card picture. Yet instead of licking their wounds and saying they're a year away, they made moves to prevent the erosion. They finally landed a closer in Paul Sewald from the Seattle Mariners and grabbed veteran outfielder Tommy Pham for power and veteran infielder Jace Peterson for depth. If the Diamondbacks are going down, they're going to go down fighting.

## Philadelphia Phillies

Did you really expect Dave Dombrowski to let a trade deadline go by without giving his team every chance to return to the World Series? They got veteran starter Mike Lorenzen, giving up prized minor league infielder Hao-Yu Lee, and now believe they have a fighting chance to play deep into October.

## Toronto Blue Jays

They have been disappointing for most of the season, but they are sitting in the last AL wild-card berth and making sure this could still be a year worth remembering. They traded for Cardinals closer Jordan Hicks, and when All-Star shortstop Bo Bichette injured his knee, they quickly grabbed Hicks' teammate, too, shortstop Paul DeJong. The future, the Jays decided, is now.

## Losers

## Seattle Mariners

The Mariners went 17-9 in July, tied for the best mark in baseball, pulling to within 3½ games of a wild-card berth. So how do they reward the players and coaching staff? By waving the white flag, giving up closer Paul Sewald for two Diamondbacks outfield prospects. The trade would have been acceptable in the winter. It was disgusting in the middle of a pennant race.

## Cleveland Guardians

This season has been a constant struggle. The pitching has been banged up. The offense has been anemic. But they are just two games out of first place in the AL Central. Instead of fighting, they decided to quit. They gave up their best starter, Aaron Civale, for a future first baseman. They gave up their current first baseman, Josh Bell, for a future outfielder. Sure, they were long shots to reach the World Series, but once you get into the playoffs, as we've learned, anything can happen. Now it's impossible.

## San Diego Padres

Who doesn't love owners who will spend money, get the biggest stars, and do everything possible to win? But when it clearly isn't working, when you have a losing record four months into the season, when you're unable to produce a four-game winning streak, and you still are buying pieces at the deadline instead of selling, when are you considered delusional? The Padres had spectacular trade chips in starting pitcher Blake Snell and All-Star closer Josh Hader, listened to a few casual offers, but instead of selling, actually added pitching and offense, making their payroll even fatter. "We just never got anything," Padres GM A.J. Preller said, "that was that compelling to push us." It's a massive gamble. Perhaps reckless.

## San Francisco Giants

The Giants are 2½ games back of the Dodgers in the NL West race. Did someone forget to tell them? They did nothing except pick up Mariners outfielder A.J. Pollock and infielder Mark Mathias for cash or a player to be named later, while the two teams behind them, Arizona and San Diego, made aggressive moves. They'll have a whole lot of explaining to do if they miss the playoffs.

## Minnesota Twins

Just because the Guardians didn't do a thing, virtually handing the AL Central title to Minnesota, the Twins were still permitted to make a trade. They needed bullpen help. They needed another right-handed bat. They could have been creative, trading one of their starters for a power hitter. They did nothing. We're not counting their swap of struggling right-handed relievers last week of Jorge Lopez for Dylan Floro. Hey, just because you get a free T-shirt and cap by making the playoffs, it doesn't mean you can't try to go a little further.

## New York Yankees

Didn't you guys used to be the Yankees? The team with a fat bank account and ability to trade for whoever you desired? They came away with relievers Keynan Middleton of the White Sox and Spencer Howard of the Rangers. That was it. They didn't invest in the present and didn't make moves for the future. The team with the second-highest payroll, an hitting list in the AL East, didn't do a damn thing. See you next year.

# Realignment fallout affects Pac-12, Playoff

Decades of tradition were tossed aside in a matter of days. The Big Ten and Big 12 expanded. The Pac-12 stands on the verge of collapse.

There is a sense of unease in college sports over what may come next. Are there more rounds of conference expansion and realignment in the near future? There are also feelings of disappointment and resentment over the way TV partners have inserted themselves into this debate.

Here's what we know about these landscape-shifting moves and what might come next:

## Why did the Big Ten do this now?

Think of it like this: You're at the supermarket with a full cart on your way to the checkout line. You've hit all the items on your list and feel good about where things stand. But as you get in line, you see a deal that seems too good to be true — two half-priced bags of potato chips, and one of your favorite brands, too. Sure, the chips aren't your favorite flavor, and you have two bags of your preferred chips in your cart. But how can you turn down such a great deal when you're in the mood for chips?

For the Big Ten, adding Oregon and Washington is not just about continuing the westward expansion that began with last year's addition of UCLA and Southern Cal for the 2024 season. The Ducks and Huskies are expected to join the Big Ten and receive roughly half the annual media rights payout given to the rest of the conference, with small escalators every year until the Big Ten's current contracts with CBS, Fox and NBC conclude in 2030. That deal was and is too good to pass up.

There is a consensus that the two former Pac-12 schools would've remained part of the conference had its Commissioner George Kliavkoff been able to land a meaningful media rights deal. Instead, the proposed subscription-based model with Apple failed to move the needle, with Arizona President Robert C. Robbins likening the agreement to

"selling candy bars for Little League or Girl Scout cookies."

So the Big Ten swooped in with a financial offering that even at a discounted rate would exceed what Pac-12 members expected to receive from Apple. Oregon and Washington couldn't say no.

## What happens to the Pac-12?

The Pac-12 brand remains so strong that it seems ripe to continue in some form or another even without the members that have left for greener pastures: Oregon, UCLA, USC and Washington for the Big Ten, and Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado and Utah for the Big 12.

There are two ways to stave off the dissolution of a league that has existed for over a century:

- Expand. Look to the Mountain West and elsewhere for schools hungry for an upgrade in reputation and notoriety. Several high-profile schools, such as Boise State and San Diego State, have publicly angled for Pac-12 membership in the past and may remain interested. Buyouts for MWC schools drop following the 2024-25 season.

- Merge. Instead of trying to draw teams from the MWC, the Pac-12 could pitch a merger and create a reimagined West Coast schools football conference.

What can the Pac-12 offer that would attract TV dollars that could make them competitive with bigger leagues?

## What happens to the Pac-4?

The last four standing in the Pac-12 are California, Oregon State, Stanford and Washington State.

California and Stanford are in better position to land in another Power Five league. Both can offer the Bay Area market to broadcast partners and a slew of successful non-mainstream sports that would fit comfortably in the Big Ten or ACC. That the two schools have sterling academic reputations also doesn't hurt.

But California's athletic department carries a massive amount of debt driven in part by annual interest payments on recent stadium refurbishments, which could be an issue.

As dire as the situation may be for the Golden Bears and Cardinal, there will be no Power Five lifelines thrown at Oregon State and Washington State.

## What will the SEC and ACC do?

While the ACC could be in the market for expansion, the league could be occupied by efforts to keep current members such as Florida State in the fold.

Last week, FSU President Rick McCullough said the school would have to consider leaving the ACC without "radical change to the revenue distribution." Translated, that means: We want more money on an annual basis than Syracuse, for one example, so fork it over.

As it stands, ACC members are locked into a long-term rights deal through 2036 with annual payouts due to be dwarfed by the Big Ten and SEC. To leave the conference, a member would have to pay a nine-figure exit fee equal to three times its annual revenue and negotiate an agreement with the ACC to allow its games in the new conference to be televised.

But if premier ACC teams can be come dislodged from this contract, the SEC will be waiting. The league will add Oklahoma and Texas next summer, bringing its membership to 16 schools. The SEC isn't interested in the expansion options currently available, but that would quickly change if FSU, Clemson or Miami hit the market.

## What about Notre Dame?

Notre Dame is in the same position as always: independent and happy. Will recent developments force the school's hand after decades and decades without any conference affiliation?

Notre Dame would be the biggest acquisition in realignment history.

The two main factors that would drive the school to consider leaving independent status behind are finances and the ability to play for the national championship. From a broadcast-partner perspective, Notre Dame's contract with NBC expires in 2024. But incoming athletic director Pete Bevaquac was previously the chairman of NBC Sports, increasing the likelihood the school re-signs with the network at a higher annual rate.

And when it comes to competing for championships, Notre Dame is one of the most obvious beneficiaries of the 12-team College Football Playoff bracket set to debut in 2024.

Speaking of the playoff ...

## What happens to the College Football Playoff?

The conference moves are expected to bring changes to the projected format. As established, the 12-team model guaranteed spots for the top six conference champions, ensuring at least one Group of Five participant, with the remaining six spots going to at-large bids. That will be altered given the dissolution of the Pac-12 as a Power Five league.

While there are a few ways the playoff's board of managers could see these options are the most realistic:

- Go with five automatic spots and seven at-large bids. This would be the easiest way to maintain the established 12-team format.

- Just pick the dozen "best" teams. This would clearly be the preference of leagues such as the SEC or Big Ten, which in a given year might put three or four teams into the playoff.

Realignment won't prevent the broader change to the 12-team playoff. But the details and minutiae of the model may be impacted dramatically.

Taking the lead from an Arizona State softball player, Mississippi football coach Lane Kiffin took the opportunity Tuesday to criticize former Pac-12 schools for leaving the conference for greener pastures.

Kiffin responded to a social media post from ASU sophomore Shannon

Cunningham, who said she "chose to play in the PAC-12 because of the ability to play close to home and in front of family. I chose the PAC so my family didn't have to worry about far travel or giving up all their vacation time just to come see me."

Kiffin previously was the coach at Southern Cal, which will leave the Pac-12 for the Big Ten in 2024. He hasn't been shy about expressing opinions about his former conference.

"Sorry they obviously didn't think about how it would affect the ones that actually have to play, travel, and go to class the next day!!" Kiffin said in Tuesday's post.

Somewhat curiously, Kiffin tagged the Pac-12 in the post, despite directing his ire at the schools that will no longer be part of the conference.

Social media being what it is, many of the responses to his comments called him out for not only that, but for frequently changing jobs — from Tennessee to USC to Florida Atlantic to Ole Miss in an 11-year span. —

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

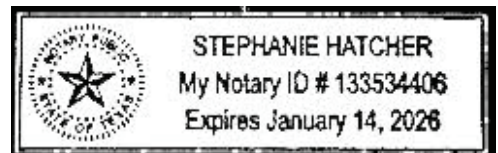

# What we learned from KU's basketball games in Puerto Rico

## SAN JUAN, PUERTO RICO

It remains to be seen if Kansas' weeklong early-August trip to Puerto Rico will help the Jayhawks win games during the early portion of the 2023-24 regular season.

There's no denying that the trip — one that included a 35-point opening victory over Puerto Rico's Select Team and a 1-1 record against the Bahamian National Team — should give the 2023-24 Jayhawks a head start in facing real competition.

Being 2,244 miles away from home in a tropical environment with a lot of free time on the travel itinerary after practices and games in a six-day span just might have provided a boost to team morale, as well.

"I definitely think it will (help team bonding)," senior guard Nick Timberlake said after the Jayhawks' 87-81 loss to the Bahamian National Team on Monday at Ruben Rodriguez Coliseum. The Jayhawks defeated Team Bahamas 92-87 Saturday and Puerto Rico Select 106-71 Thursday on the other two games on the trip.

"I mean whether we were at the games or at the beach or in the pool, something like that ... we all had a great time this week," Timberlake added.

It was quite a difference from what the Jayhawks experienced the past two months. During the summer-school session, the Jayhawks practiced with, and against, team members day in and out.

The three exhibition games in Puerto Rico allowed the Jayhawks to guard and be guarded by somebody other than teammates.

"It felt good to play somebody besides each other," KU junior forward KJ Adams said after scoring 19 points on a 7-of-10 shooting in KU's rout of Puerto Rico Select.

He followed that with 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting in the five-point Game Two victory over the Bahamian National Team. With his knee bothering him he had just three points in the final game vs. Team Bahamas.

"We came out here to compete. It was great to finally get to play some-

body else," senior forward Parker Braun said. Instead of guarding the likes of Hunter Dickinson (team-leading 19.0 scoring average in Puerto Rico) every day at practice, the 6-11 Braun averaged 1.7 points and 3.3 rebounds in the games in Puerto Rico.

KU coach Bill Self, who has said the 10 practices leading up to the trip to Puerto Rico may have been more important than the games, considers the trip a resounding success.

The team hotel, the Fairmont of San Juan, is one of the nicest resorts the Jayhawks have stayed in during his 21 years at KU. The practice facility at Catholic school Academia del Perpetuo Socorro where the Jayhawks worked out on off days was spacious and air conditioned.

And the site for the three exhibition games, Ruben Rodriguez Coliseum, provided a big-time atmosphere with 12,000 seats. The only problem was occasional slippage on logos placed on the court. In fact KU sophomore Arterio Morris bumped his knee after slipping on a logo and suffered a bone bruise that prevented his playing in Game Three.

"It's a very nice building, a lot better building than we are used to playing in when we take foreign trips," Self said. "Basketball is by far the biggest sport here from what everybody tells me, mainly the NBA still."

"Going to Puerto Rico to me is a huge advantage for us because it's Spanish

speaking but also English speaking and you don't have to go through customs. I think this is a great place and it was a great trip," Self added.

Point guard Dajuan Harris summed up the trip by saying: "We had fun. Team bonding, our chemistry got better. The games, I think we got better too. Playing the pros (Buddy Hield, Eric Gordon of the Bahamas Team) I think helped us get better. The pros made us better. It'll make us better through the season. "I definitely had fun but I'm ready to go home."

Here's a recap of the three games played in Puerto Rico:

### GAME 1: KU BASKETBALL 106, PUERTO RICO 71

The Jayhawks ran away with this one, rolling to a 14-2 lead and never looking back. KU unleashed a fast-paced offense led by speedy guards Harris, Morris, Kevin McCullar and Elmarko Jackson.

Morris, one of the main standouts, cashed three 3s in five attempts and scored 20 points with five rebounds, five assists and two steals. Adams was 7-of-10 shooting and scored 19 points with four rebounds. Jackson went 3 of 4 from 3 and finished with 13 points and two assists.

Timberlake and Zach Clemens, who is still set to redshirt, had similar games. They each earned two threes and scored eight points.

Newcomer big man Dickinson was solid with

13 points on 6-of-13 shooting.

KU brought energy on offense and defense. The Jayhawks came up with 15 steals and forced 24 turnovers while holding Puerto Rico to 35.4% shooting (7 of 29 from 3).

"I actually thought we played pretty well, obviously early," Self said. "We got out and they couldn't get a shot off. We haven't really worked on a lot of things defensively, but we've done some things offensively and I thought we shared the ball for the most part."

Utter domination showed on the stat sheet. KU outscored Puerto Rico 48-24 in points in the paint, 35-14 on fast-break points and 55-27 in bench points.

"I don't know that we have played faster than this, but it's also summertime," Self said. "And in real games people don't wait to get easy baskets. But I did think we looked pretty quick at times."

Added Self: "All in all it was a good first day."

### GAME 2: KANSAS 92, BAHAMAS NATIONAL TEAM 87

As many as four NBA players appeared on the roster of Team Bahamas. Harris led the way with 23 points on 10-of-14 shooting. He was 3 of 7 from 3. McCullar went for 19 points followed by Dickinson (16) and Timberlake (13).

"There was nothing disheartening about this. This doesn't mean anything and it's probably not bad for us to get hum-

bled a bit," Self, whose Jayhawks are expected to be ranked No. 1 or 2 in 2023-24 preseason polls, said.

Self, who follows the NBA closely, was again impressed with Hield, a 6-4, 30-year-old former Oklahoma Sooner who hit four 3s in the 10-minute third quarter.

Hield and Gordon did not play the fourth quarter. With those two in the game, the score was Team Bahamas 69, KU 65.

"Pat 'em on the butt. Those were good plays," Self said. "I thought we defended Buddy and Eric pretty well to be honest. Buddy made some unbelievable shots, unbelievable. He could be an all-star eventually."

A third NBA player, Ayton, elected to work out an hour before the game but passed on playing in the contest for Team Bahamas.

KU coach Self considered Harris a bright spot. "Juan looked to score; that was a positive," Self said. "I thought we did some good things. We missed not having Arterio out there. Hopefully we can get Johnny (Furphy, new addition to the team who will arrive in Lawrence for the start of the school year) out there so we have more depth."

"We didn't shoot the ball (well). I thought we took some marginal shots. We turned it over (16 times) to lead to layups. We were just way too careless with the ball. That was good competition."

The Jayhawks will have to wait four years for their next summer excursion. The NCAA allows such trips once every four years. The KU players, who have been in Lawrence since early June for summer school, now will head to their hometowns and be back in Lawrence for the start of class on Aug. 21.

Scoring leaders on the trip: Hunter Dickinson 19.0 ppg, Kevin McCullar 13.6, Arterio Morris 13.5 (2 games), KJ Adams 13.0, Elmarko Jackson 10.6, Dajuan Harris 9.0 and Nick Timberlake 8.6.

McCullar had 13 points, five assists and four rebounds in 21 minutes. He fouled out in the fourth quarter when KU was up by nine points. Team Bahamas, which trailed 42-36 at halftime, cut the gap to two but never could surge past the Jayhawks.

McCullar enjoyed guarding Hield. "To be able to match up with guys like that ... that's who I want to be guarding every night when I get to the league. So I appreciate him pushing me and we were talking trash and having fun," McCullar said.

"He told me after the game (to) keep staying aggressive this year and just have fun. It was good advice from him and I appreciate that."

The trash talking was good-natured between Indiana Pacers guard Hield and McCullar. In fact, Hield spoke to the 6-7 McCullar after the game. "What'd he say?"

"That I had the talent, I just have to be aggressive," McCullar said.

# Childers' 'Love' video tells gay love story

LGBTQ+ advocates and musicians have hailed the new video for Tyler Childers' song "In Your Love" as a much-needed portrait of inclusivity.

The song is the first from Childers' upcoming album "Rustin' in the Rain" (out Sept. 8) and chronicles devotion to a loved one. The twist the video delivers is that the love story is between two men who fall in love in 1950s rural Appalachia, face attacks from co-workers at a coal mine, then move together to tend a farm.

The video, which stars Colton Haynes ("Teen Wolf," "Arrow") and James Scully ("You," "Fire Island") as the coal miners, lands amid controversy over another country music video, Jason Aldean's "Try That in a Small Town."

CMT pulled Aldean's video after many criticized it for touting gun violence and lynching — and viewers noting some scenes were filmed at the Maury County Courthouse in Columbia, Tennessee, where an 18-year-old Black man named Henry Choate was lynched in 1927.

After the video for Childers' song hit YouTube on Thursday, fellow musician Margo Price posted on X, formerly Twitter, "I hope people share it and lift up good songwriting, deep music and positive messages because we could use more of this right now."

Singer/songwriter Jason Isbell offered his support and wrote, "Go @TTChilders go — much respect."

Out Magazine posted: "Grab your tissues! Tyler Childers' new music video for #InYourLove tells a beautiful story of gay Appalachian love."

**What did fans have to say about Tyler Childers' 'In Your Love'?**

Online, many compared Childers' video with the one from Aldean.

One reason Childers wanted to do this music video, he told Ann Powers of NPR, "was my cousin growing up, who's

like my big brother, is gay."

On YouTube, where "In Your Love" had been played more than 3.1 million times as of Tuesday, there were 15,000+ comments. One viewer wrote: "Seeing this song go viral immediately after 'Try That in a Small Town' feels good. It's great to see left wing music listeners promoting a song to make their voices heard as well."

"I would like to thank all the hateful ignorant 'country fans' screaming about this video, as I had never heard this angelic voice before," another comment read. "Thank you for helping me find this beautiful loving soul."

But not everyone was supportive. On Facebook, where the video has been viewed 1.8 million times, one commenter posted, "Disappointed. This could

have been a wonderful opportunity to show real love and commitment."

"Tyler Childers just bulldozed himself," another wrote, referencing a consumer boycott against Bud Light after it partnered with transgender influencer Dylan Mulvaney. "And that's sad cause he was my fav."

**Childers had a personal reason for making the music video**

Childers had some help with the video, from friend and bestselling author Silas House ("Lark Ascending"), who wrote the treatment and served as creative director.

House and husband Jason Kyle Howard, a journalist and author — both are native Kentuckians, as is Childers —

came up with the story idea. The video was directed by Bryan Schlam, who also has directed videos for the Black Keys and James Bay.

**Everyone knew that 'we were part of something special'**

"Everyone on the shoot seemed to know we were part of something special but we had no idea that the video would be even more pertinent by the time it was released," House told USA TODAY.

"One of our goals for this video was to represent rural and Appalachian people in a complex, dignified way since they are not often shown that way in visual media," said House, who also is the Kentucky Poet Laureate.

Family stories and photos helped "create the most authentic love story we could ... that could capture (the song's) passion, beauty and emphasis on the power of an endless love," House said.

"We also knew that a lot of people would be seeing themselves for the first time in a country music video and it has been deeply moving to hear from many of them," he said. "All of their love for the video and the song far outweigh the hatred that is rearing its head in response to it."

In a news release for Childers' album and the video, House said, "As a gay teenager who loved country music, I could have never imagined seeing myself in a video."

"That visibility matters. There have always been LGBTQ people in rural places and finally, we're seeing that portrayed in a country music video."

Childers expects that some country music fans won't appreciate the statement.

"For all the ugliness that it's going to bring out that just can't be helped, this video is going to make real conversations possible," he told NPR. "This is a story of two people sharing their love and living a life together and experiencing loss. That's pretty powerful."
