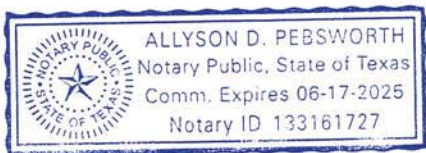

Penn State seeks rushing savior

Penn State really doesn't have a No. 1 running back, once again.

And the run game is struggling at a most inopportune time. The Nittany Lions go into a crucial road game at undefeated Iowa with their starter battling through some type of injury and the backups inconsistent.

The Lions are 11th in the Big Ten in rushing yards per game (137.2). They are 12th in third-down conversions (36.5%).

Noah Cain, the official starter, played little against Villanova two weeks ago and was ineffective against Indiana. He's not resembling the rugged, sled dog who pulled Penn State to a fourth-quarter victory at Iowa two years ago.

He started with a handful of big plays in the second half of the opener at Wisconsin. Overall, though, he's averaging just 3.2 yards per carry. Head coach James Franklin did not provide details on his health.

"I'd like for us to be more physical and pound it up there and get the four or five

yards and trust it ...," Franklin said. "I think Noah can do even more. We've seen flashes of Noah doing some really good things. I think we've all seen what Noah has the ability to do. In terms of what he's working through, that's part of the year is working through things."

Penn State has struggled to find a

feature running back since Miles Sanders left after the 2018 season. Or, as Franklin put it, the team has simply relied on rotating talents to keep legs fresh and healthy for entire games and through the season.

Last year, injuries stole their top two options before the second possession of the opening game. Two years ago, the Lions rotated runners beginning to end.

Penn State has mostly used three runners with modest success.

After starring as a rookie, Keyvone Lee has gotten much less work recently even though he was billed as faster, better and more experienced in preseason camp. He's carried the ball just 28 times. He does hold a 6.2 average and has the longest run from scrimmage, a 44-yarder up the middle against Indiana. But he's also struggled at times, especially trying to bounce runs to the outside where's he been caught and dropped.

Franklin admitted that rotating runners doesn't easily allow for any to get into a rhythm. "But until somebody steps up and shows they are the guy, it's hard for us ... to just crown somebody.

We'd love for that to happen again."

While the offense, overall, ran the ball more effectively against the Hoosiers it still was stop-and-go and struggled decisively on short-yardage situations. Quarterback Sean Clifford still bails the team at times by breaking away from the pocket.

The Lions look even worse when they need just a yard or two to keep a drive going. Holes rarely open and the running backs usually cannot save the situation with an elusive move.

Franklin preached patience and gradual progress.

Iowa's standout defense, though, may not permit it.

"I think more than anything it's a mentality. We've got to be more physical," Franklin said. "There are times when we're on a double team (block) and we're not getting as much movement as we need to get."

"If we are who I think we are, we've got to be able to line up and get a yard or two when we need it ... when everybody in the stadium knows we're going to run the ball."

Iowa defense keying in on Penn State QB

Iowa's defense has made a habit of benching quarterbacks in 2021.

Maryland's Taulia Tagovailoa was the latest to receive the Hawkeyes' defense harsh treatment in Friday's 51-14 thrashing: 157 passing yards (compared to his 335 season average) and five interceptions (compared to one entering the game).

Maryland coach Mike Locksley had no choice but to remove his starter from the game, making him the fourth coach in five weeks to do so. While benching quarterbacks isn't an official statistic or even a goal for Iowa's defense, this metric provides context to their early season success.

"It's given us a lot of confidence," veteran defensive back Kaevon Merrifield said. "I think we understand what we need to do. I think we're an experienced group now, with a young defensive line they have a lot more experience going on game six. We understand what needs to be done each week."

This week's assignment? Penn State

quarterback Sean Clifford is a familiar opponent. Saturday's game will be the third meeting against Clifford, and in 2019 he came into Kinnick Stadium and led the Nittany Lions to a 17-12 win.

Without question, this will be the best version of Clifford yet. This season he ranks third in the Big Ten in passing yards (1,336), passing touchdowns (11) and completion percentage (67.3%).

And like Iowa's Spencer Petras, he's riding an impressive winning streak of his own with nine in a row as a starter.

"(Clifford) is a veteran player, can make any throw that they ask him to make," head coach Kirk Ferentz said. "He's a veteran player, a leader, a guy they look to."

Like any quarterback, the main component in stopping Clifford the passer is with consistent pressure by the defensive line. Fourth-ranked Penn State's offensive line shut out Indiana's defense in sacks in Saturday's 24-0 win. Statistically, the matchup between the respective lines in this game is a toss-up. Penn State ranks sixth in the Big Ten in sacks allowed (8) and Iowa ranks seventh in team sacks (13).

"We need to get pressure in his face to get him off his mark," defensive lineman Logan Lee said. "Number one thing is push the pocket, collapse the pocket and try to get pressure and cause a disruption on the throw."

Without pressure, Clifford has

proved to be one of the most accurate passers in the country. According to Pro Football Focus, Clifford is completing 72% of his passes when in a clean pocket this season; this is an 8% upgrade since he first became the starter in 2019.

A clean pocket for Clifford means he can connect with his top receiver Jahan Dotson at a dangerous rate. Dotson, like Clifford, has third-ranked Iowa's full attention in game planning. The two have connected for the most touchdowns in Penn State history (18) and Dotson has recorded at least one 20-yard reception in eight consecutive games.

Neutralize Clifford means neutralizing Penn State's big-play ability.

"Everything," Ferentz said when asked what impressed him about Dotson. "That's what you have to realize: You're playing a team that can close the gap really fast because they've got some guys ... He's the guy, really good guy."

"As dangerous as anything" Ferentz said of Clifford. "If it's not there for him, something opens up, he'll pull it down and go. He'll throw off the run or take it and make the yardage necessary for a first down or even more than that."

Red Sox might have swagger back for playoffs

BOSTON — For three months, the Red Sox were an aggravating enigma, a first-place team relegated to wild-card status thanks to their ragged play and maddening inconsistency, fueling doubts that this club that sent a league-high five players to the All-Star Game might be anything but championship caliber.

If the Red Sox sauntered cautiously onto the Fenway Park field for Tuesday's American League wild-card game against the similarly fickle Yankees, they earned every right to swagger off it.

After a dominant and at times electric 6-2 triumph over their archrivals, the Red Sox are giddily pondering something besides their own validity.

Specifically, can a 3-hour, 12-minute display of startling baseball rid them of the second-half wobbles and launch a potential championship run?

"We just did something pretty spectacular," says shortstop Xander Bo-

garts, who made the two biggest plays of the night — a two-run, first-inning home run off Gerrit Cole that tossed figurative kerosene over an already lit Fen-

way Park crowd, and a perfect relay throw to cut down Aaron Judge at home plate and preserve a 3-1 lead in the sixth.

Bogaerts' struggle mirrored those of his team. The Red Sox imperiled their postseason chances when the Yankees flattened them in a three-game sweep at Fenway in late September, with Bogaerts' 1-for-12 performance the beginning of a season-ending 5-for-32 skid.

They did not back into the playoffs — a 1-5 skid stopped with a season-saving sweep at Washington to equal the Yankees' 92 wins — but the narrative was established.

The Red Sox could not find their footing after a COVID-19 outbreak ravaged the roster. Their many defensive and base running lapses would be their undoing and certainly, they were in too deep against Stanton and Cole and the imposing Yankees. But they overcame the Yankees. And maybe looking in the mirror isn't so daunting anymore.

"Sometimes it looks horrible," says manager Alex Cora, "but 93 times this

year it hasn't looked horrible, so we're going to keep rolling."

All the way to Tampa Bay. Game 1 of the AL division series is Thursday (8 ET, FS1) at Tropicana Field, with the Red Sox strangely in the role of underdog. Ace Nathan Eovaldi — who dazzled with eight strikeouts and no walks in 5 1/3 innings Tuesday — won't be available until Game 3 Sunday at Fenway Park.

The Rays seized the AL East lead from Boston on July 31, and the defending AL champions won 100 games for the first time in franchise history.

"They are a very clean team, to be honest," says Bogaerts. "You see with the pitching staff or especially defensively, they don't give any extra outs. That's a team that plays best."

The Red Sox now have a chance to topple the Rays and claim their second championship in four years.

"Now we go to the next one," says Cora, "and we've just got to be ready to face a great baseball team. We have a huge challenge. But we're ready for it."

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

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



If the provisions of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person, fact, situation or circumstance are held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application of such provisions to the other persons, facts, situations or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications and, to that end, any and all provisions of this ordinance and applications thereof are declared to be severable.
