Brabon was the prayer leader for what was perhaps the greatest campus revival in American history, in February 1970.

Prayers were answered again this past February, as Jesus moved in similar power. Among them were students from 284 colleges who came seeking revival for their own campuses.

In The Coming Tsunami, Dr. Jim Denison states: "As earthquakes hundreds of miles away from any shore can result in a singular, sweeping tsunami that plunges a country's coastline into chaos, so, too can long-pa cultural upheavals threaten to drown Christianity.

As Dr. Denison reminds us, revivals always begin with prayers of power with these characteristics:



The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has made available for public comment on the Recreational Use Attainability Analysis for Bijo Cypress Creek (4045A) in the Cypress Creek Niver Basin, within Hopkins, Wood, and Franklin counties and Recreational Use Attainability Analysis for Lilly Creek (0409A) in the Cypress Creek Niver Basin, within Upshur and Camp counties.

A use-attainability analysis (UAA) evaluates designated or presumed uses if there is reason to believe the standards for a water body are inappropriate due to local conditions. A Recreational Use-Attainability Analysis (RUAA) is a specific type of UAA that is conducted to evaluate and determine what category of recreational use is appropriate for a particular water body. RUAAs are typically site-specific studies that assess reasonably attainable recreational uses based on the physical and flow Supporting information, including surveys of individuals and organizations with firsthand knowledge of a water body, is also collected to assess historical and existing patterns of recreational use.

There were contending baseball teams that used Tuesday's trade dead-line to augment their chances of reach-ing the promised land. There were con-tenders that used the deadline to intenders that used the deadme to in-stead become pretenders. And there were teams that still don't have the slightest idea whether they're a con-tender or a pretender. Then there are the Houston Astros

and the New York Mets. The teams that symbolized the winners and losers of

You thought the Astros, the defend-ing World Series champions, were going to sit idly by and watch the Texas Rang-

to sit fully by and watch the Lexas kang-ers and Los Angels had up? Then, you don't know owner Jim Crane. Crane, who has turned his franchise into a powerful juggernaut, winning four American League pennants and two World Series titles the last six years wants to make sure their champio

window isn't ready to close yet.

The Astros engineered the block-buster of the trade deadline, bringing back future Hall of Fame pitcher Justin Verlander from the Mets for two of their top prospects and having the Mets chip in a cool \$53 million, too. It wasn't a trade. It was a heist. Oh, sure, it cost the Astros prospects

Drew Gilbert and Ryan Clifford, but in return they get Verlander, who has been dominating the National League, yield-ing a 1.95 ERA in his past nine starts and with a 3.15 ERA this season.

So the Astros passed on matching the So the Astros passed on matching the two-year, \$86.6 million contract with a \$35 million vesting option the Mets gave Verlander in the offseason and now are getting him for less than half price. The Mets are paying \$35 million of the SSS million Verlander is sowed through 2024. If his \$35 million option is exer-cised, which becomes automatically vested with 140 innings pitched, they'll chip in another \$17.5 million. It means the Astros are paying just \$40.5 million to have Verlander's services for twoplus seasons. No wonder the Astros could barely

contain their euphoria with the news, wanting to break out champagne before they even took the field before their against the Cleveland Guardians

"I feel like it's opening day today," As-tros third baseman Alex Bregman said pregame. "It's definitely going to provide a huge boost, not only energy-wise, but also to be able to have a guy like him

A few hours later, Framber Valdez threw the season's third no-hitter and the 16th in franchise history, a 2-0 win at Minute Maid Park.

While the Astros were ready to party, the Mets were preparing for a funeral. Their season is over. Not just this season, but next year too

and perhaps even 2025.

Max Scherzer, who was traded to the Rangers over the weekend, revealed Tuesday that he waived his no-trade clause after being informed by Mets owner Steve Cohen and general management of the perhaps of the control of the c ager Billy Eppler that the franchise does not expect to contend again for a few

"The math changed on them," Scherzer said at his press conference. ing Air-Star Coser Edwin Diaz and shortstop Francisco Lindor. They have already spent more than \$100 million just buying prospects in their sell-off, so they certainly don't in-tend to stop now. They have collected eight of their top 24 prospects in trades this past week and have done a 180, spending nearly \$500 million in payroll and taxes to try to buy a championship to now buying a farm system.

"You have to go through a little pain to

get where we want to go," Eppler said.
"Our organization is making strides for a
better future. ... We want to make the
best out of the circumstances."

They spent more money than any other team in baseball history, but four other team in baseball history, but four months later the team's plans to be a World Series champion in five years went into foreclosure. If nothing else, it's Cohen's rude awakening to the baseball business.

Here's a look at the rest of the winners and losers from the trade deadline

Los Angeles Angels

Well, now that the Mets would seem to be out of the running for Shohei Ohta-ni and the San Diego Padres are still stuck with all of their bloated contracts for their hunch of underachievers, the Angels have a better chance than ever to retain Ohtani. They traded away their top prospects for a starter (Lucas Giolitop prospects to a stafter (Lucas Gioni-to), reliever (Reynaldo Lopez), first baseman (C.J. Cron) and outfielder (Randal Grichuk) and now are squarely in the hunt for their first postseason berth since 2014. Even if they don't make the playoffs, Ohtani can at least see they're trying, and why leave when he's seeing first-hand that money can't guarantee even a winning record? The trade deadline eliminated a few of Ohtani's suitors in one glorious afternoon.

The Rangers spent \$700 million in free agency the past two years, then went big in the trade market. They went oig in the trade market. They grabbed Jordan Montgomery and Chris Stratton from the St. Louis Cardinals, Scherzer from the Mets, and catcher Austin Hedges from the Pittsburgh Pi-rates to help replace injured All-Star Jonah Heim. Just like that, they are serinah Heim. Just like that, they are seri-ous heavyweight contenders, trying to go where they haven't been since 2011 when they were one strike away from winning the World Series. Who knew the epicenter of MLB's powerhouses would be deep in the heart of Texas.

Baltimore Orioles

A year ago, they traded away popular outfielder Trey Mancini to Houston and outlieter Trey wanchi to Houston and All-Star closer Jorge Lopez to the Min-nesota Twins, with GM Mike Elias say-ing their team might be good enough to reach the postseason but didn't believe they could make it out of the wild-card round. This time, with the Orioles sitting in first place in the AL East, he didn't flinch, trading away prospects for Cardinals starter Jack Flaherty. He'll look good pitching in October.

Miami Marlins

The Marlins are hanging on for dear life in the NL wild-card race and have struggled for a month, but they refuse to struggettor a mount, but they retuse to look ahead to next year. They want to win right now. So they acquired power hitters Jake Burger from the Chicago White Sox and Josh Bell of the Cleve-land Guardians as well as pitcher Ryan Weathers from San Diego. It's rather refreshing to see a team whose odds to reach the postseason is only at 45%, ac-cording to FanGraphs, but still pushed their chips all-in.

Arizona Diamondbacks

They have played awful baseball the past month (8-16), sinking in the standings from first place in the NL West to sitting just outside of the wild-card picsitting just outside of the while-card pic-ture. Yet instead of licking their wounds and saying they're a year away, they made moves to prevent the erosion. They finally landed a closer in Paul Se-wald from the Seattle Mariners and grabbed veteran outfielder Ton Pham for power and veteran infielder
Jace Peterson for depth. If the Diamondbacks are going down, they're going to go down fighting.

Philadelphia Phillies

Did you really expect Dave Dombrowski to let a trade deadline go by without giving his team every chance to return to the World Series? They got vetreturn to the world series? They got ver-eran starter Mike Lorenzen, giving up prized minor league infielder Hao-Yu Lee, and now believe they have a fight-ing chance to play deep into October.

Toronto Blue Javs

They have been disappointing for most of the season, but they are sitting in the last AL wild-card berth and makin the last AL wine-card berth and mak-ing sure this could still be a year worth remembering. They traded for Cardinals closer Jordan Hicks, and when All-Star shortstop Bo Bichette injured his knee, they quickly grabbed Hicks' teammate, too, shortstop Paul DeJong. The future, the Jays decided, is now.

Seattle Mariners

The Mariners went 17-9 in July, tied for the best mark in baseball, pulling to within 3½ games of a wild-card berth. within 32 games of a wind-card bertin. So how do they reward the players and coaching staff? By waving the white flag, giving up closer Paul Sewald for two Diamondbacks outfield prospects. The trade would have been acceptable in the winter. It was disgusting in the middle of a pennant race

This season has been a constant This season has been a constaint struggle. The pitching has been banged up. The offense has been anemic. But they are just two games out of first place in the AL Central. Instead of fighting, they decided to quit. They gave up their best starter. Aaron Civale, for a future first baseman. They gave up their cur-rent first baseman, Josh Bell, for a future outfielder. Sure, they were long shots to reach the World Series, but once you get into the playoffs, as we've learned, any thing can happen. Now it's impossible.

San Diego Padres

Who doesn't love owners who will spend money, get the biggest stars, and do everything possible to win? But when it clearly isn't working, when you have a losing record four months into the season, when you're unable to produce a four way to the start of the season. duce a four-game winning streak, and duce a four-game winning streak, and you still are buying pieces at the dead-line instead of selling, when are you considered delusional? The Padres had spectacular trade chips in starting pitcher Blake Snell and All-Star closer Josh Hader, listened to a few casual of Josh Hader, listened to a few casual of-fers, but instead of selling, actually add-ed pitching and offense, making their payroll even fatter. "We just never got anything," Padres GM A.J Preller said, "that was that compelling to push us." It's a massive gamble. Perhaps reckless

San Francisco Giants

The Giants are 2 ½ games back of the The duthis at 27 games oack of the Dodgers in the NL West race. Did some-one forget to tell them? They did noth-ing except pick up Mariners outfielder A.J. Pollock and infielder Mark Mathias for cash or a player to be named later, while the two teams behind them, Arizona and San Diego, made aggressive moves. They'll have a whole lot of explaining to do if they miss the playoffs

Just because the Guardians didn't do a thing, virtually handing the AL Central title to Minnesota, the Twins were still permitted to make a trade. They needed bullpen help. They needed another bullpen help. They needed another right-handed bat. They could have been creative, trading one of their starters for a power hitter. They did nothing. We're not counting their swap of struggling right-handed relievers last week of Jorge Lopez for Dylan Floro. Hey, just because you get a free T-shirt and cap by making the playoffs, it doesn't mean you can't try to go a little further.

New York Yankees

Didn't you guys used to be the Yan-kees? The team with a fat bank account and ability to trade for whoever you desired? They came away with relievers Kevnan Middleton of the White Sox and Keynan Middleton of the White Sox and Spencer Howard of the Rangers. That was it. They didn't invest in the present and didn't make moves for the future. The team with the second-highest pay-roll, and sitting last in the AL East, didn't do a darn thing. See you next year.

Realignment fallout affects Pac-12, Playoff

Decades of tradition were tossed aside in a matter of days. The Big Ten and Big 12 expanded. The Pac-12 stands on the verge of collapse. There is a sense of unease in college

sports over what may come next. Are there more rounds of conference expansion and realignment in the near future? There are also feelings of disappointment and resentment over the way TV partners have inserted themselves into this debate

Here's what we know about these scape-shifting moves and what

Why did the Big Ten do this now?

Think of it like this: Vou're at the supermarket with a full cart on your way to the checkout line. You've hit all the items on your list and feel good about items on your list and feel good about where things stand. But as you get in line, you see a deal that seems too good to be true – two half-priced bags of potato chips, and one of your favorite brands, too. Sure, the chips aren't your favorite flavor, and you have two bags of your preferred chips in your cart. But how can you turn down such a great deal when you're in the mood for chips? For the Big Ten, adding Oregon and

Washington is not just about continuing when the westward expansion that began with last year's addition of UCLA and Southern Cal for the 2024 season. The Ducks and Huskies are expected to join the Big Ten and receive roughly half the annual media rights payout given to the rest of the conference, with small escarest of the conterence, with small esca-lators every year until the Big Ten's cur-rent contracts with CBS, Fox and NBC conclude in 2030. That deal was and is

conclude in 2030. That deal was and is too good to pass up. There is a consensus that the two for-mer Pac-12 schools would've remained part of the conference had its Commis-sioner George Kliavkoff been able to land a meaningful media rights deal. Instead, the proposed subscription-based model with Apple failed to move the needle, with Arizona President Robert C. Robbins likening the agreement to

selling candy bars for Little League or

seining candy bars for Little League or Girl Scout cookies."

So the Big Ten swooped in with a fi-nancial offering that even at a discounted rate would exceed what Pac-12 men bers expected to receive from Apple. Oregon and Washington couldn't say no.

What happens to the Pac-123

The Pac-12 brand remains so strong that it seems ripe to continue in some form or another even without the mem-bers that have left for greener pastures: Oregon, UCLA, USC and Washington for the Big Ten, and Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado and Utah for the Big 12.

There are two ways to stave off the issolution of a league that has existed

for over a century:
• Expand. Look to the Mountain • EXPAND. LOOK TO THE MOUNTAIN WEST AND ELSEWHERE FOR SCHOOLS HUNGRY for an upgrade in reputation and notoriety. Several high-profile schools, such as Boise State and San Diego State, have publicly angled for Pac-12 membership in the past and may remain interested. Buyouts for MWC schools drop follow-

ing the 2024-25 season.

• Merge. Instead of trying to draw teams from the MWC, the Pac-12 could pitch a merger and create a reimagined West Coast schools football conference

What can the Pac-12 offer that would attract TV dollars that could make them competitive with bigger leagues?

The last four standing in the Pac-12 California, Oregon State, Stanford

and Washington State, Stanford and Washington State. California and Stanford are in better position to land in another Power Five league, Both can offer the Bay Area marleague. Bout can over the Bay Area mar-ket to broadcast partners and a slew of successful non-mainstream sports that would fit comfortably in the Big Ten or ACC. That the two schools have sterling academic reputations also doesn't hurt.

But California's athletic department carries a massive amount of debt driven in part by annual interest payments on recent stadium refurbishments, which could be an issue.

What will the SEC and ACC do?

While the ACC could be in the market for expansion, the league could be occu-pied by efforts to keep current members such as Florida State in the fold.

Last week, FSU President Rick

McCullough said the school would have "radical change to the revenue distribu-tion." Translated, that means: We want more money on an annual basis than Syracuse, for one example, so fork it

As it stands, ACC members are locked into a long-term rights deal through 2036 with annual payouts due to be dwarfed by the Big Ten and SEC. To to be dwarred by the Big Ten and SEC. To leave the conference, a member would have to pay a nine-figure exit fee equal to three times its annual revenue and negotiate an agreement with the ACC to allow its games in the new conference to be televised.

But if premier ACC teams can be-come dislodged from this contract, the SEC will be waiting. The league will add Oklahoma and Texas next summer, bringing its membership to 16 schools. The SEC isn't interested in the expansion options currently available, but that would quickly change if FSU, Clem-son or Miami hit the market.

The two main factors that would drive the school to consider leaving independent status behind are finances and the ability to play for the national championship. But incoming athletic director Pete Bevacqua was pre-viously the chairman of NBC Sports, in-creasing the likelihood the school resigns with the network at a higher an-

And when it comes to competing for championships, Notre Dame is one of the most obvious beneficiaries of the 12team College Football Playoff bracket set to debut in 2024.

Speaking of the playoff ..

What happens to the College Football Playoff?

The conference moves are expected to bring changes to the projected for-mat. As established, the 12-team model guaranteed spots for the top six conference champions, ensuring at least one Group of Five participant, with the remaining six spots going to at-large bids.
That will be altered given the dissolution of the Pac-12 as a Power Five league.
While there are a few ways the play-

off's board of managers could go, these options are the most realistic:

- Go with five automatic spots and seven at-large bids. This would be the easiest way to maintain the established 12-team format.
- Just pick the dozen "best" teams.
 This would clearly be the preference of leagues such as the SEC or Big Ten, which in a given year might put three or four teams into the playoff.

Realignment won't prevent the broader change to the 12-team playoff. But the details and minutiae of the model may be impacted dramatically.

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

LGBTQ+ advocates and musicians have hailed the new video for Tyler Childers' song "In Your Love" as a muchneeded portrait of inclusivity.

The song is the first from Childers' upcoming album "Rustin' in the Rain" upcoming album "Rustin" in the Rain" (out Sept. 8) and chronicles devotion to a loved one. The twist the video delivers is that the love story is between two men who fall in love in 1950s rural Appa-lachia, face attacks from co-workers at a coal mine, then move together to tend a

The video, which stars Colton Haynes ("Teen Wolf," "Arrow") and James Scully ("You," "Fire Island") as the coal miners, lands amid controversy over another country music video, Jason Aldean's "Try That in a Small

Town."

CMT pulled Aldean's video after many criticized it for touting gun violence and lynching – and viewers noting some scenes were filmed at the Maury County Courthouse in Columbia, Tennessee, where an 18-year-old Black man named Henry Choate was lynched in

After the video for Childers' song hit YouTube on Thursday, fellow musician Margo Price posted on X, formerly Twit-Margo Price posted on X, formerly Twit-ter, "I hope people share it and lift up good songwriting, deep music and posi-tive messages because we could use more of this right now." Singer/songwriter Jason Isbell of-food big seasons and week of the property of the pro-

singet/songwriter Jason isoen of-fered his support and wrote, "Go @TTChilders go – much respect." Out Magazine posted: "Grab your tis-sues! Tyler Childers' new music video for #InYourLow tells a beautiful story of gay Appalachian love."

What did fans have to say about Tyler Childers' 'In Your Love'?

Online, many compared Childers' video with the one from Aldean.

One reason Childers wanted to do this music video, he told Ann Powers of NPR, "was my cousin growing up, who's

It's great to see left wing music lis-teners promoting a song to make their voices heard as well."

"I would like to thank all the hateful

"I would like to thank all the hateful ignorant 'country fans' screaming about this video, as I had never heard this angelic voice before," another comment read. "Thank you for helping me find this beautiful loving soul."

But not everyone was supportive. On Facebook, where the video has been viewed 1.8 million times, one commenter nosted. "Discoppointed This could

ter posted, "Disappointed. This could

have been a wonderful opportunity to show real love and commitment

show real love and commitment."
"Tyler Childers just budlighted himself," another wrote, referencing a consumer boycott against Bud Light after it
partnered with transgender influencer
Dylan Mulvaney. "And that's sad cause
he was my fav."

Childers had a personal reason for making the music video

Childers had some help with the video, from friend and bestselling auwho wrote the treatment and served as creative director.

House and husband Jason Kyle How-

ard, a journalist and author – both are native Kentuckians, as is Childers –

was directed by Bryan Schlam, who also has directed videos for the Black Keys and James Bay.

Everyone knew that 'we were part of something special'

"Everyone on the shoot seemed to know we were part of something special but we had no idea that the video would

but we had no idea that the video would be even more pertinent by the time it was released," House told USA TODAY.
"One of our goals for this video was to represent rural and Appalachian people in a complex, dignified way since they are not often shown that way in visual media," said House, who also is the Kentucky Poet Laureate.
Family stories and photos helped "create the most authentic love story we could ... that could capture (the song's)
