NFLPA chief talks labor battles, legacy

DeMaurice Smith is stepping down after more than 14 years as executive di-rector of the NFL Players Association. His tenure included guiding players through an NFL lockout, two long-term

collective bargaining agreements, the COVID-19 pandemic and an overhaul in how the league treats concussions as part of myriad health and safety mea-

As he prepares the players union for Yale, Smith, 59, engaged in an extended interview with USA TODAY Sports – prior to the election of Lloyd Howell as his successor - that reflected on his impact

Q: With labor peace attached to the NFL's tremendous economic growth, why are you leaving now? DeMaurice Smith: "I actually made a

DeMaurice Smith: "I actually made a pledge to myself after the 2011 CBA that I was going to do three things: I was going to look at the 2011 CBA as the ground floor, in order to spring forward to the 2020 CBA that would build on all the things that we fixed in 2011. I also swore that whenever we got the next CBA done and the organization was in the perfect place for transition, I would be there for the new executive director. Coming into this job (in 2009) without Gene Upshaw being there was the toughest single thing that I've ever had to do in my career. And the third pledge was, man, I've had three great careers. I've been a pros-ecutor, a partner with a major law firm. There are some things that I know I still enjoy doing. I think it's time for me to manage my transition to the final chapter of my transition to the final chapter of my transition.

ter of my career." Q: Why did you want the job in the first place?



DS: "I was approached by the search committee for the job. I was headed back to the Department of Justice as a U.S. Attorney when I got the call to see if I would be interested. After I met with the players, it was just the sheer inequithe players, it was just the sheet inequi-ty that the players were facing in 2009 – remember, the NFL told the players they wanted a 20% rollback in their salaries, they wanted the players to play two games for free, they wanted to take away our pensions - all of those things away vur peristoris – an or those things just struck me as just a really unfair, le-veraged way to treat the people who work in the game. After talking to the players and realizing that they were serious about fighting these things ... that's when I became hooked in wanting

Q: What are you most proud of considering your tenure with the NFLPA?

DS: "We ran this as a player's union, where the players made the decisions. Having players in the negotiating room, leaving decisions to deal with their own destiny, I'm most proud of. I'm also destiny, I'm most proud of. I'm also proud that in the labor management dynamic, a union has to be able to fight. There are always going to be the detractors out there, but I'm not sure that anybody would have a view that this isn't a union that, when it came time to fight

union that, when it came time to ngin for our players, that's what we did. "And we achieved a lot of change out of it. When I came into the job, there were no concussion protocols. Just think about that. The league, at the think about that. The league, at the time, had a group of people working on concussions and they called them the 'Mild Traumatic Brain Injury Commit-tee, 'Mild' The committee was run by a rheumatologist. We have moved from... over the last 15 years we have led the over the last 15 years we have led the way on player health and safety, and now you see almost everything that this union proposed and accomplished, you see it all the way through sports now. Return-to-play guidelines. Pulling peo-

been concussed. Credentialing doctors.
"I'm extremely proud of how we addressed the economics of football. When we came in in 2009, before the 2011 CBA, everybody used to talk about the salary cap. We never had a salary cash floor. Teams could always say that the cap was going up, but what we found the cap was going up, but what we found in 2010 and 2011, many teams were spending below 80% of the salary cap. What good is a cap if people aren't spending to it? And now most teams spend 99% of the salary cap. Those things become incredibly important to a group of players who, for the most part, only play three years. We were able to create a new business called OneTeam Partners, that for all of the unions that are a part of OneTeam Partners, that en tity is now the largest asset on the books for any union in the world. So, I'm proud of a lot, but I'm mostly proud of the players and the staff at the NFLPA. No one works harder for the players than them."

Q: What was the toughest chal-

lenge?
DS: "All of it. I'm not sure I appreciated the personal toll that comes with a job like this."

Q: How do you prepare for that?

OF HOW ON you prepare to that?

DS: "I was a homicide prosecutor for a long time. I worked at a big firm and had big cases. The difference in this job is that we all know that football is America's sport. This job requires you to be more of a fan of the players than the game. What that necessarily means is that – well, you're always fighting with the owners, but sometimes you're fighting with the jlayers because you want the focus to be far more on their wellthe focus to be far more on their well-being and their long-term (health) than what they might think is important in the moment. That takes a toll. My kids were young when I took this job. They're grown and they're gone now. Trying to balance being a good father, being at home, against the demands of the job, it's a toll. It's an emotional toll, it's a psy-chological toll and it's a physical toll. It's also been professionally and spiritually rewarding to me." rewarding to me.

O: You were the "outsider" when elected over Troy Vincent, Trace Arm-strong and David Cornwell in 2009. How did that ultimately help you suc-

DS: "My career wasn't tied to being

executive director of the NFL Players Association. If we fight, I always tried to fight with an understanding that I don't need anything from anyone in football. I had two great careers, and I'm teaching now. I never wanted to do this job think-ing, 'Don't ruffle feathers, don't be too confrontational because you need to

"And I've gone through, what, four

"And I've gone through, what, four elections, five elections, a lockout, COVID, two CBAs, Deflategate, all of it. "And so, I've never approached any of those things from a perspective of, 'Why don't we just try to get along?"

"The players had an interest, and that deserves to be protected. Even if it comes at my expense. I also wasn't afraid of listening."

Q: How you like to be remembered, as far as your NFLPA legacy?

as far as your NFLPA legacy?
DS: "Was not afraid to fight for what's right. I don't spend a whole heck of a lot of time trying to change people's minds who think a certain way. Yet I had a cou-ple mistakes. There's always a few pie mistakes. There's aiways a rew things that you'd like to do over. But when I look at the arc of the last 15 years, I've aiways tried to find out what the right answer was, and I've never been afraid to fight for what I felt was right."

Q: What did you not accomplish?
DS: "I've always wanted our players
to understand their power. And then to
understand that because you have this
power you have an obligation to use it.
I've been a big critic of why our players

go to OTAs for free. Or why players put team stuff on their social media ac-counts. Why they do anything that gives away their power. It may be that I wasn't good enough in explaining that, or I wasn't good enough in exhanimg inat, or it wasn't good enough in exhorting them to do that. I always wished that I could have done a better job of convincing players to use the power that they have, even if it resulted in some short-term

"You know the union made the decision to go on strike three times in (the years before Smith came aboard). And they weren't successful because players crossed the picket line. But instead of looking at those strikes as failures. I've looking at those strikes as failures, I've always appreciated the guts that it took for the players to go on strike in the first place. That was people deciding that they were going to use their power. One of the best photos on the eighth floor (at

consequence for them.

NFLPA headquarters in Washington, D.C.) is a photo of Franco Harris, on a picket line, holding a sign calling for fairness from the owners. And I'm not Tairness from the owners. And I'm not sure players today ... let me put me put it this way. The owners know that players are willing to go to O'Ta's for free. The signal that that's sending to owners is that players will never strike. And that means that they view that as a net advantage in their calculation of who has

"We have been very successful in the bargaining room, we've been very suc-cessful in litigation, because I made no cessium inigation, because i made no secret of using litigation as an asym-metrical way of bargaining. But one of the reasons why we fought all of those cases so hard that I just mentioned, you can ask yourself on one hand, will the players strike for a neutral arbitrator? Probably not. But because we fought those cases so hard, and literally to the death, we arrived at neutral arbitration in bargaining because the league just simply didn't want to fight that way anysimply didn't want to fight that way any-more. So, we've been extremely suc-cessful in the bargaining room, ex-tremely successful in using litigation as a strategy, we've been very successful in growing the financial resources of the game, In 2030 (after the current CBA expires), I expect there will be a challenge to the players' resolve to withhold their services. And I guess we'll find out." Q: What advice would you give to

your successor?

DS: "Know your history. Engage your strategy. Fight like hell."
Q: How involved have you been in helping to choose your successor?
DS: "I made it clear when the exec-

utive committee started the process search because the players need to own this. The new executive director needs to know, just like I did, even though I went through a messy election in 2009 went through a messy election in 2009, that he has the backing of the players. The players need to own it. But the most important thing is the owners have to know that this was the players' decision, because that's the only thing that gives you power when you are negotiating.

Q: As the transition looms, how would you describe your mindset? DS: "I'll do whatever I can to help the next person, but I'm also happy. It's

MLB players want one change in pitch clock

SEATTLE - Major League Baseball is open to considering the possibility of adding a few seconds to the pitch clock in the postseason, but Commissioner Rob Manfred says he prefers to keep the rules the same as they are in the regular

"We don't want a postseason game decided by a rules violation, and I un-derstand it's a possibility," Manfred said Tuesday before the All-Star Game. "In terms of doing something for the postseason, we're going to continue to talk to the players.

"I think you ought to play the post-season the way you play the regular sea-son. There's exceptions. I'm open-minded on that topic."

"But I prefer to keep the same rules in
the regular season and postseason."
The pitch clock implemented for the
first time this year provides 15 seconds
for pitchers to begin their delivery with no runners on base and 20 seconds with

no runners on base and 20 seconds with runners on base.

There have been 721 pitch-clock vio-lations this season, but 60% of the games have had no violations and just 12% of the games featuring multiple vio-

Tony Clark, executive director of the Major League Baseball Players Association, says the feedback he has received from players is that they would prefer to provide longer than 15 seconds between pitches with no runners on base during the postseason. The union can make its recommendation but cannot mandate a

change.
"I don't believe there's any player, nor do I believe there are too many folks that want to have a new rule dramatically afwant to have a new rule dramatically ai-fect a game in a pennant chase or in the playoffs," Clark said. "Players believe that there are some adjustments that could be beneficial in the grand scheme of things so that we're not having a conversation about a new rule and instead focused in on the game being played."

The average time of nine-inning games with the pitch clock is 2 hours, 38

minutes - 26 minutes less than a year ago. It's on pace to be the fastest nine-inning games since 1984. "We are comfortable with the way the clock and the violations, particularly

late in the game in high-leverage situa-tions, have been managed," Manfred

 MLB, which took the All-Star Game Mind, winch took the Air-Stat Game out of Atlanta in 2021 out of protest of Georgia's restrictive voting law, will now strongly consider Atlanta as site of the 2025 All-Star Game, Manfred said.
The Toronto Blue Jays, Baltimore Orioles and Chicago Cubs also are on the best list of these will be the state of the said.

Orloies and Chicago Cubs also are on the short list of teams under consideration. The decision is expected to be made at the owners meetings in November in Arlington, Texas. The 2024 All-Star Game will be

The 2024 All-Star Game will be played in Arlington, and the 2026 All-Star Game will be in Philadelphia. "The level of interest among our clubs hosting an All-Star Game is really, really high," Manfred said. "I think that as time goes by, I'm more focused on keeping track of when a game was last there, and trying to get back to places where we haven't been in a really long time."

 Clark and the union remain opposed to an international draft.
"We don't believe an international

we don't believe an international draft is necessary," Clark said. "I'm not a fan of drafts, any drafts."

discussions about reducing the 162game schedule, but not at the expense of player salaries.

'We've had conversations about the we've had conversations about the length of schedule in past negotiations," Clark said. "The conversation often stops with the conversation that we had during COVID, which is rolling back player salaries."

Court 18 incidents result in 3 arrests at Wimbledon

FIELD LEVEL MEDIA

Two separate incidents involving protesters on Court 18 resulted in the arrests of three persons on Wednesday at Wimbledon. Just Stop Oil activists stormed the court of two different matches and unloaded containers of confetti and puzzle pieces

onto the grass court. Two men and a woman were taken into custody and removed from the grounds. They were charged with aggravated trespass and criminal damage, accord-ing to a post from the Wimbledon Twitter ac-count.

count.
The first match that was disrupted was between No. 21 seed Grigor Dimitrov

and Sho Shimabukuro, a match won by Dimitrov in straight sets. "Obviously it's not pleasant," said Dimitrov. "In the end of the day, there is not much you can do. I think everyone in a way did their part as quick as possible."

The second match disrupted was between British wild card Katie Boulter and Daria Saville of Australia. Both players helped clean up the debris before Boulter went not win in straight sets.

The incidents took place despite "uplifted" security measures being taken by the All England Club. The measures that were announced last week came in the aftermath of similar incidents in Britain, including a cricket match last Wednesday between England and Mastralia. Anti-oil activists and protesters also disrupted the Premiership Rugby final, World Snooker Championship and the Grand National horse race, among others.

Retired Barty announces birth of baby boy

Former World No. 1 Ashleigh Barty on Tues-day announced the birth of her first child.

"Our beautiful boy. Welcome to the world, Hayden!" Barty wrote on Instagram along with a photo of the newborn.

Barty, who is married to Garry Kissick, announced her retirement in March 2022 - two months after she won the Australian Open. She also won Grand Slam singles titles at the 2019 French Open and 2021 Wimbledon.

She won 27 combined titles (15 singles, 12 dou-bles) and earned nearly \$24 million in prize

money. Barty held the WTA's No. 1 rating for 114 con-secutive weeks, the fourth-longest streak in history. Only Steffi Graf (186 weeks), Serena Williams (186) and Martina Navratilova (156) had longer runs.

Scotland hosts event to honor king

nation's crown jewels

LONDON - It was Scotland on pa-LONDON – It was Scotland on pa-rade. Bagpipes, kilts, drums and a Shet-land pony named Corporal Cruachan IV marched down Edinburgh's Royal Mile on Wednesday to honor King Charles III. Two months after his lavish corona-

tion at Westminster Abbey in London, Scotland hosted its own event to mark the new monarch's accession to the

throne.

While Charles and Queen Camilla weren't crowned a second time, the new king was presented with the Honors of Scotland - the crown, scepter and sword of state - items he received with sword of state – items he received with reverence during a service at St. Giles' Cathedral. The Stone of Destiny, an im-portant symbol of Scottish identity, was also moved to the cathedral for the fes-tivities.

The presence of these icons of Scotland's nationhood is a mark of respect land's nationnood is a mark of respect for a country that is fiercely proud of its history and where the desire of some for independence has never died, even though it has been bound to England and the United Kingdom since 1707. Scotland's national government is led by the Scottish National Party, which is calling for a second independence refer. calling for a second independence referendum

"It's not a coronation," said George It's not a coronation, said deorge Gross, an expert in coronations at King's College London. "But it's very symbolic in that Scotland has its own identity."

Wednesday's events in Edinburgh were a continuation of Charles' effort to were a continuation of Chaires eirort to cement ties throughout the United Kingdom as he tries to show that the 1,000-year-old monarchy remains relevant in modern Britain. Soon after the death of his mother, Queen Elizabeth II, last September, Charles visited Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales before extradicate the tree fixes the control. attending the state funeral in London.

Just as during May's coronation ceremony, Wednesday's events linked historic traditions with nods to the multicultural nature of Britain today. The
choir sang a psalm in Gaelic, and pas-

sages of the New Testament were read in Scots, as the church service honored two of Scotland's historic languages Non-Christian leaders offered prayers or messages of support, reflecting the monarch's longtime interest in interfaith issues.

Charles was also presented with a new sword made by Scottish artisans and named after Elizabeth. The sword was in place of the current sword of state, which was made in 1507 and was considered too fragile for use in the ceremony.

But it was the sermon of the Rt. Rev.

But it was the sermon of the Rt. Rev. Sally Foster-Fulton, moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, who underscored Charles' devotion to protecting the environment.

Society will be on the right track when people understand that "the Heavens and Earth" are not commodities or possessions, she told the congregation.

"Blessed are we, on the right track are we, when we understand that our chil-dren do not inherit this Earth from us -we have borrowed it from them," she said. "And it is our duty to return it still

Our Republic, which campaigns for an elected head of state in Scotland, staged a protest outside the Scottish parliament, and shouts of "Not our king" were picked up by microphones as Charles left the cathedral.

"The vast majority of Scotland didn't "The vast majority of Scotland didn't care to celebrate the coronation in May, with support for the monarchy at an all-time low in Scotland," the group said in a statement. "Charles' perpetual need to celebrate his reign, with all the pomp and pageantry it requires, is a spit in the face to the people struggling with the cost of living."

The coronation festivities began in the early afternoon with a People's Procession that traveled down the Royal Mile from Edinburgh Castle to the cathedral. It included more than 100 people. ple representing charities and public service groups, such as the Scottish Ambulance Service, the Royal Scottish Highland Games Association and the

Friginand Games Association and the Girls' Brigade.
At its head was Shetland pony Corporal Cruachan IV, regimental mascot of the Royal Regiment of Scotland.

The Honors of Scotland, the coun-try's crown jewels, followed behind es-

try's crown jewels, followed behind es-corted by police and military units. Soon after, Charles and Camilla left the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the king's official residence in Edinburgh, which sits at the opposite end of the Royal Mile. They traveled to the service be-hind the Household Cavalry Mounted Beginnettend collections of sulfitzers. Regiments and a collection of military

Historically an independent country, Scotland was first linked to England in 1603 after the death of Queen Elizabeth I. Because the queen had no children, the crown passed to her cousin James VI, who was already king of Scotland,

VI, who was already king of Scotland, uniting the two countries under a shared sovereign.

But Scotland remained independent until 1707 when lawmakers in both countries approved the Act of Union, which created the United Kingdom.

which created the United Aingdom. The public festivities were also deeply personal for Charles, who received the crown of Scotland on roughly the same spot where he stood vigil last year, watching over his mother's coffin with the same crown resting on its lid.
