





## K-State nears full roster by landing Kentucky transfer

Jerome Tang has made a big addition to the Kan-sas State basketball roster. In more ways than one. Ugonna Onyenso, a 7-foot forward who spent the past two seasons play-ing for Kentucky, an-nounced his intentions to transfer to K-State on Tuesday while he was on a recruiting visit to Manhat-tan.

That is big news for the Wildcats for two reasons. First, he becomes the 12th scholarship player that has committed to play for K-State next season. Tang will have a complete ros-

ter with one more addi tion. Second, Onyenso is simply a big player who will bring both size and athleticism to the K-State frontcourt once he puts on

frontcourt once he puts on a purple uniform. Several other notable college basketball teams were recruiting Onyenso out of the transfer portal, including North Carolina, Mississippi State and Oregon. Winning a recruiting battle against that type of competition in June is always meaningful. The Wildcats landed one of the best available players on the market.

Onyenso only put up modest stats at Kentucky, as he averaged 3.6 points and 4.8 rebounds while

playing in 24 games last season. But he did make 14 starts for the Wildcats and he was once a highly touted high school recruit. Perhaps a change of scen-ery will help him reach his full potential as he plays his final two years of col-lege basketball. The NBA Draft was an option for Onyenso, but he

option for Onyenso, but he decided to return to college after testing the professional waters last month.

K-State will have a tall frontcourt next season. The Wildcats have also landed Arkansas transfer Baye Fall, who checks in foot-11.

It has been a busy offseason for Tang and the Wildcats. They lost 10 scholarship players from last year's squad, leaving them with only David N'Guessan, Macaleab Rich and Taj Manning as returning players. 



Cause, dun. Did you water her at the U.S. Championships? Or any other competi-tion since she returned last year? The question is who joins the four-time gold medalist on the squad for Par-is. And that answer is now both clearer in some ways and murkier in others than it

some ways and murkier in others than it was a few days ago. Suni Lee and Skye Blakely improved their prospects with their performances at nationals last weekend. But now there are concerns about the health of Shilese Jones, who was considered almost as much of a lock as Biles until she withdrew from nationals to protect her in-jured shoulder.

"There's been a little bit of progress,"

Jones told NBC on Sunday night, "I woke up and I was like, 'it's feeling a little bit better than this whole week.' It's been a little bit stiff, but some progression to-

day."
The Olympic trials for gymnastics are June 27-30, so it's not time to panic just yet. In the meantime, here's a look at the contenders:

Suni Lee: Lee competed the allaround for the first time since last spring, when a kidney ailment forced her to cut her final season at Auburn short.

"Coming off this meet, I know what I'm capable of now, so that will put even more confidence in myself," she said. "I

see myself in training so I know what I can do. But to be able to finally put it out there on the floor and show everybody and myself, it really means a lot to me."

Jordan Chiles: The Tokyo Olympian is making steady improvement, but it was her silver medal on uneven bars that really stood out. Remember that the format for team fi-

nals is three gymnasts on each event and all three scores count, and Chiles would give the U.S. women insurance on bars

Hezly Rivera: The U.S. junior champion last year made quite an impression in her first nationals as a senior, finishing fourth on balance beam and fifth on un-

# US men's gymnastics team is taking shape

FORT WORTH, Texas – Given the se-lection procedures for the U.S. men's gymnastics team practically require a Ph.D. in math to understand, and are Ph.D. In math to understand, and are heavily dependent upon results at the Olympic trials later this month, predic-ting who is going to the Paris Games is something of a fool's errand.

sometning of a roots errand.

But we're going to do it anyway!

The short version of the selection procedures is the trials winner locks a spot on the Paris squad, so long as he's also in the top three on three or more events, U.S. champion Brody Malone events. U.S. champion Brody Malone was close to that at nationals, finishing first on high bar, second on still rings, fourth on pommel horse and fifth on parallel bars last weekend. Even if he doesn't have those three

top-threes, however, Malone is all but top-threes, however, Malone is all but assured of going to Paris. He's less than a year removed from his third surgery to repair a gruesome knee injury and only decided a few weeks ago to do the allaround here, yet he won his third title

Malone has had success interna-tionally, too, finishing fourth in the all-around at the world championships in 2022, the same year he won the title on

As for the other four spots ...
The selection procedures require the team to be picked based on who would give the Americans the best scores in give the Americans the best scores in both qualifying, when teams can drop their lowest score on each event, and fi-nals, where three gymnasts compete on each event and every score is counted. There's no scenario in which Malone wouldn't be at the top of both of those

lists. In fact, in team finals, he'd prob-

floor and could also contribute on high bar and still rings.

Young is actually good on pommel horse – long the bane of existence for the U.S. men – and was the silver med-alist on it at last year's world championships. He could anchor vault, as well,

having won a silver in that event, too, and could give the Americans a third big score on parallel bars.

Score on parauet pars.
Yul Moldauer puts up big numbers on
parallel bars and floor exercise, and
could contribute on vault and rings, too.
If you've been crunching the numbers, you see there's still a hole to fill on

floor, pommel horse, vault and high bar, And if you've been looking at the scores from nationals, you see that, as things stand now, Paul Juda is the guy for that

last spot.

Juda was sixth in the all-around at nationals, a full point behind Shane

Wiskus, But look at Juda's best events and you see he could provide what the U.S. men still lack.

- His 14.75 on floor the first night was the second-best score on the event of the entire meet.
- Only Young, Malone and the specialists were better on pommel horse.
  His vault score on Day 2 trailed only
- Young.

   Juda, Malone and Richard were the

 Juda, Maione and Richard were the only guys to go 14 or better on high bar, Juda doing it on the second night.
There are other options, of course.
The U.S. men could take specialists Stephen Nedoroscik or Patrick Hoopes to get another big score on pommel horse get another to get the three-up, their weakest event in the three-up, three-count team final format. But nei-ther Nedoroscik nor Hoopes do other events, meaning the Americans would be shoring up one event at the expense of three others

And if any of the other four gymnasts got hurt, the U.S. men's hopes of win-ning their first medal since 2008 would take a serious hit.

They could take Wiskus, a Tokyo Olympian whose consistency is one of Olympian whose consistency is one of his greatest strengths. But Wiskus' best events are places where the U.S. men have other options that, at nationals at least, provide a higher score in the team

The reasoning is similar for bypass-ing Cameron Bock and Donnell Whit-tenburg. Unless someone is going to give you a decisive advantage on at least one event, the Americans are better off

taking the guy who can give them coverage on the most events.

Of course, all this could change at Olympic trials. With the Paris Games now less than two months away, however, the team is starting to take shape.

Katie Ledecky, the greatest female swimmer in history, is known for winning Olympic gold medals in the most impressive fashion. But something few might be aware of is what happens when she comes into the post-race press conference, where she spends quite a bit of time deflecting attention from herself and focusing a her comp from herself and focusing on her competitors

So how does a person who would rather talk about others than herself ac-tually write a book – about herself? "You may have picked up on it that I

"You may have picked up on it that; idid deflect a little bit by talking about all the people that have played such an instrumental role in my life," Ledecky said during a recent interview as she discussed her new memoir, the fabulously

cussed ner new memoir, the ialououssy titled "Just Add Water," which was published Tuesday by Simon & Schuster.
"I guess that actually is talking about myself," she acknowledged, "but I really do feel like I'm the product of all the people around me, the people who have come before me, definitely my grand-parents, my parents, my brother, my aunts and uncles, cousins. Really I don't think I would be the swimmer I am with-

out them. So it was great to be able to reflect on that and share a lot of their stories."

This is a big week for the 27-year-old Ledecky. In addition to the debut of her first book, she will compete at the U.S. Olympic swimming trials in Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis (yes, a pool has been built inside an indoor football sta-dium) where she is expected to qualify for her fourth U.S. Olympic team in multiple events.

Ledecky will be one of the most-watched athletes at the Paris Games, where she will try to add to her Olympic cache of seven gold medals and three

silvers. While she likely will be favored silvers. While she likely will be lavored to win gold in the women's 800 and 1,500 freestyle events as she did in To-kyo three years ago, she will not go unchallenged as younger swimmers who

chailenged as younger swimmers who grew up idolizing her are now some of her top rivals.

But first, she's dishing out some valuable advice in her new book, which in many ways is the perfect primer for parameters which is the best in the chair of the perfect primer for parameters. ents and their athletic children.

As she details her childhood at a neighborhood pool in the suburbs of Washington, D.C., she had no aspirations of going to the Olympics. She was

swimming just for fun.

"Twe seen it with teammates that they tell the story of how right when they started swimming, they wrote in a first-grade paper that they wanted to go to the Olympics, or somebody declared the the started swimming. that they were going to be an Olympian when they won the 25 free at age 8," she

"That was never me and that was never my family. I loved swimming and I definitely fell in love with it right from the start but I played other sports. I was pretty decent at basketball and soccer and was competitive and loved being active, so I loved all these things I was doing.'

doing."

As for swimming, she said, "I watched it on TV but when I watched swimming, I never thought I would be at that level. I thought that that was some

other realm. I thought that's so far off other realm, I thought that s so lar on and it wasn't really until I started qual-ifying for these bigger and bigger meets that all of a sudden qualifying for Olympic trials was the next meet and at that pic trials was the next meet and at that point, it came into the picture and I learned how you qualify for the Olym-pics."

But, she said, "It wasn't the goal from a young age. And so I think that is an im-

a young age. And so I think that is an important message, it's a message that you don't have to be great right from the get-go, you don't even have to have that goal right from the get-go, there are different journeys that everyone takes."

For anyone looking for tabloid drama or even a hint of scandal, this isn't the book for you. It's just the opposite, a de-lightful escape from our rancorous world to a place where hard work pays off and dreams do come true.

"I feel very fortunate that I have had a very happy life and no major injury or huge setback or abuse or anything in my life that has derailed me from the path that I've wanted to take," Ledecky said. "When I started writing this, I knew it

"When I started writing this, I knew it would be a very positive story. "Having that gold medal, seeing the way that it makes little kids smile, older people smile, it can light up somebody's face, and so just that impact is something that's very meaningful to me and if the book can be a small part of adding to that, then that's great and means a lot to me."

But this week, as he prepared for the U.S. Open at Pine-hurst No. 2, he is preaching boring.

"Looking forward to a tough test of golf out here. Pinehurst is no joke," De-Chambeau said. "You have to hit it in the middle of the greens. And this is a Boo Weekley quote, but the center of the

green never moves, so I'll try to focus on that this week."

DeChambeau has become so popu DeChambeau has become so popular in part because he goes against the grain and is willing to try things no one else does, and he does it spectacularly. From single-length irons, swinging out of his shoes on drives and tinkering of his shoes on drives and tinkering with every little aspect of his swing, he's not afraid to go out on a limb to gain an advantage while on the course. However, at a major championship test that's a bit different than others,

don't expect DeChambeau to swing for

don't expect DeChamboeau to swing for the fences on every tee box. "It stinks hitting a 6-iron off the tee compared to a driver, but sometimes you've got to do it and you've got to make the right decision for shooting make the right decision for shooting the lowest score out here," DeCham-beau said. "There's numerous holes like 3, i'd love to go for that green every single day, and I may go for it. I don't know, you never know with me. Certainly on the tee box if it's downwind,

tainly on the tee box if it's downwind, i'll give it a go probably."

DeChambeau finished a shot behind Xander Schauffele at the PGA Championship, finishing at 20 under. It's more than likely the winning score. will be significantly less than that this weekend, but that doesn't mean De-Chambeau won't entertain the crowds as he has during the first two majors of

the year.
"I'm looking forward to a great chal-lenge this week," DeChambeau said.
"It's a lot of boring golf. It's definitely different than Valhalla, but I'll try to do my best to show the crowd some fun drives and some hopefully long-made
