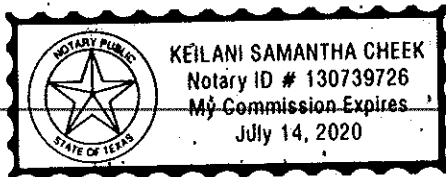



Fans play with fire when storming field, court

Someone is eventually going to die. Storming a field or a court, as Minnesota fans did after the Gophers beat Purdue on Tuesday night, might seem like a harmless tradition. A fun way to celebrate historic upsets by transforming the field of play into a raucous scene of jubilation.

But it's not. Aside from the sheer pointlessness of it — you get on the court and then what? Stand there for a few minutes looking for someone to hug or high-five? Yeah, that's a real moment to share with the grandkids — the risk of serious injury, even death, is real.

Twenty-five years ago, more than five dozen people were injured when Wisconsin fans tried to run onto the field after the Badgers beat Michigan for the first time in more than a decade. No one died, but 10 people were unconscious and not breathing when they were rescued.

Fifteen years ago, an Arizona high school student suffered a torn carotid artery and had a stroke after being thrown to the ground during the melee that followed his game-winning dunk. Joe Kay was initially paralyzed on his right side, and while he learned how to walk and talk again, he's never regained the use of his right hand.

Four years ago, Kansas coach Bill Self was pinned against the scorer's table as Kansas State fans flooded onto the court.

The crush of humanity isn't the only danger. Videos of Tuesday night's pandemonium showed Purdue center Matt Haarms brushing aside a Minnesota fan who ran into him and flipped him off while Haarms was trying to leave the

court. Imagine if the 7-3, 250-pound Haarms hadn't been so composed and had taken a swing at the much smaller fan.

Or a football player with a helmet in his hands loses his cool.

"My injuries are something I'll have to deal with the rest of my life," Kay told Yahoo Sports in a 2014 interview. "People claim (court storming) is a tradition, but we shouldn't have tradition if it's unsafe. It doesn't make sense."

No, it doesn't. And it needs to stop before someone else gets hurt. Or worse.

Several coaches have pleaded for the sophomoric behavior to stop, warning of the potential dangers, and some of the conferences have tried to rein fans in. The Southeastern Conference fines schools \$50,000 for a first offense, \$100,000 for a second and \$250,000 for a third.

"We want to have exciting experiences around SEC games but also want to maintain a safe environment for

student-athletes, coaches, spectators and officials," SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey said, explaining why Auburn was slapped with a \$100,000 fine in 2016 after its students rushed the court following a win over Kentucky.

But other conferences aren't as proactive. And some schools just don't care.

This was at least the second time this has happened at Minnesota, following a rush in 2013 after the Gophers upset then-No. 1 Indiana. When South Carolina fans stormed the court after beating Kentucky five years ago, school President Harris Pastides was right there with them.

"Once I realized I was paying (the fine) anyway, I ran down," Pastides told The Daily Gamecock. "I enjoyed every dollar."

It doesn't help that all of this is celebrated by some media outlets and, in some cases, even the conferences themselves. A shot of the fans rushing the

court is included in the Purdue-Minnesota highlight video on the Big Ten's YouTube channel. One of the videos of the 2013 pandemonium was posted by the Big Ten's own network. Which is why the NCAA needs to step in.

The NCAA prohibits court storming at its championships and, with very few exceptions, has been successful in preventing it. That's partly because the number of students at these games is smaller, but it's also because the NCAA works with the various venues to ensure there's a strict security plan in place.

The NCAA doesn't have the manpower to review security or create crowd-control plans at every stadium and arena in the country. But it can penalize schools that willfully disregard safety. I'm sure being banned from the NCAA tournament would get a school's attention. Or losing a scholarship.

Harsh penalties? Sure. But something has to be done. Before it's too late.

Belmont (projected No. 11 seed): Coach Rick Byrd has had teams capable of going far in the NCAAs but never has a Belmont team been this well positioned for an at-large bid.

The Bruins (25-4) still face a tough Ohio Valley Conference tournament with a field that features fellow bubble team Murray State.

Belmont has a nice mix of senior veterans (Dylan Windler and Kevin McClain are the team's leading scorers) and freshman newcomers. The Bruins have the nation's second-best scoring offense at 88.3 points per game, so putting up points won't be an issue in a first-round matchup against a No. 6 or No. 7 seed.

Lipscomb (projected No. 12 seed): The Bison (24-6) played Belmont close in two games, beat TCU and narrowly lost to Louisville, proving their ability against tough opponents. Lipscomb does a lot of things well, including ranking in the top 10 in assists per game. Senior guard Garrison Mathews carries the offensive load for this group, having averaged more than 20 points the past three seasons.

Furman (first four out as an at-large): If the Paladins can't get past

Wofford, a team that hasn't lost a league game all season, in the Southern Conference tournament, they then have to hope the selection committee rewards them for beating Villanova on the road and posting a NET ranking of 44. Senior forward Matt Rafferty leads the team in points, rebounds, assists and steals. He had 17 rebounds in that 'Nova upset in November.

Old Dominion (projected No. 13 seed): The Monarchs (23-6) knocked off Syracuse in non-conference action behind their dynamic senior backcourt of B.J. Stith (18.1 ppg, 7.7 rpg) and Ahmad Caver (17.0 ppg, 5.4 apg). It starts on defense for coach Jeff Jones' group, as ODU ranks in the top 10 in field-goal percentage defense (38.7 percent) and scoring defense (61.2 ppg). The Conference USA regular-season winner still must take care of business in a league tournament.

Vermont (projected No. 13 seed): If the Catamounts (24-6) can get past UMBC in this year's America East tourney (the Retrievers beat them both times in the regular season), they have what it takes to pull off a first-round upset and even make it to the second weekend. Vermont is led by veteran Anthony Lamb, who averages 20.8 points and 8.0 rebounds. Senior guard Ernie Duncan (14.3 ppg) paces the backcourt.

Hofstra (projected No. 14 seed): The Pride (25-6) hung close with Maryland

and Virginia Commonwealth on the road before claiming the Colonial regular-season title. There's no shortage of experience on this team, with upper-classmen seeing most of the minutes. Justin Wright-Foreman (26.8 ppg) can take over a game. He had 48 points in a Feb. 9 win over William & Mary. But it's not just him. The Pride shoot almost 50 percent from the field and are second nationally in team free throw percentage (79.8 percent).

South Dakota State (projected No. 14 seed): Mike Daum has been a household name in the past three NCAA tournaments, but the country's most gifted mid-major big man (averaging 25.6 points and 11.7 rebounds this season) hasn't translated into first-round upsets.

That could definitely change this season thanks to Daum's help coming from the backcourt. The Jackrabbits (24-7) rank third nationally in three-point field goal percentage (41.4 percent) and rank fifth in scoring offense (85.2 ppg) thanks in part to sharpshooter David Jenkins, who had 10 three-pointers in a February game against Omaha and eight triples in two other non-league games.

Loyola-Chicago (projected No. 15 seed): It's been a bumpy ride for the Ramblers (19-12) in their encore season after last year's Final Four run. This is hardly the same team that shocked the

tournament as a No. 11 seed. But there's room for some first-round magic should Loyola win the Missouri Valley tournament as the No. 1 seed. Porter Moser's team was 7-6 in non-conference games but still found a way to win a share of the league's regular-season title. Last year's top player, Clayton Custer, has slumped, but Marques Townes (15.9 ppg) has taken control as the lead catalyst, and big man Cameron Krutwig (14.9 ppg, 7.3 rpg) developed into a force inside as a sophomore.

DirecTV Now is raising prices, dropping channels

AT&T has revamped its DirecTV Now live TV streaming service, increasing monthly subscription prices and dropping some channels, but including HBO in the packages.

New customers will be able to choose from DirecTV Now's Plus and Max packages, priced at \$50 and \$70, respectively. The Plus package has more than 40 channels including local broadcast networks (ABC, CBS, FOX, NBC, where available), as well as CNN, ESPN, Fox News, FS1, MSNBC, NBCSN, TBS, TNT, USA and HBO. The 50 channels in the Max package include those and ESPN, FS2, Golf Channel and Cinemax.

The Plus package is priced \$10 higher than DirecTV Now's previous entry-level package, the \$40 Live A Little deal, which had 60 channels, including A&E, AMC and Discovery Channel and MTV, which are no longer available on any new DirecTV Now package.

Current customers who want to keep the \$40 package – or other previous offers such as the \$55 Just Right package

– that have those channels can continue to do so, but their bills will increase by \$10 beginning April 12.

This is just the latest synergistic strategy move by AT&T, which two weeks ago saw its merger with CNN and HBO parent Time Warner upheld by a federal appeals court. In June, AT&T launched WatchTV, a so-called “skinny bundle” with more than 30 live streamed channels and thousands of TV shows and movies on demand, free for some of AT&T's unlimited wireless customers or \$15 monthly for others including non-AT&T consumers.

AT&T also plans to launch a new subscription service later this year, as does Disney. Also apparently eyeing the market is Apple, which has long been rumored to be planning a streaming content offering. The tech company has a March 25 event scheduled, and Apple is talking with AT&T, CBS and other content providers to lineup HBO, Showtime and other channels for its service, Bloomberg reported Wednesday, citing persons familiar with the situation.

A sign that AT&T might be worried about the price increases? The parent

company is increasing its DirecTV Now free trial period from one week to one month “to woo new customers to give the service a try,” said Phil Swann, publisher of The TV Answer Man site.

He notes that AT&T lost 267,000 subscribers to the service in the fourth quarter of 2018; DirecTV Now has 1.6 million subscribers, AT&T said in its fourth quarter financial report, released Jan. 30.

With the restructuring of DirecTV Now's programming choices, AT&T's “strategy seems clear. It is using HBO as its differentiator, and becoming profitable,” Todd Juenger, senior analyst with investment firm Sanford Bernstein, said in a note to investors Wednesday.

By dropping some channels – and the fees for carrying those networks – and including HBO, AT&T has a more profitable business, he says.

The move could set off a fight among other subscription TV services such as Hulu and YouTube TV for exiting DirecTV now customers, Juenger said. Or it could lead other services to pare down their channels, too.

Down time strikes Facebook, Instagram

Having trouble accessing Facebook or Instagram on Wednesday afternoon?

You weren't alone.

The massively popular social network started having problems at around noon Eastern time.

Issues popped up across Facebook proper, Facebook Messenger and Instagram around the world.

As with nearly every Facebook outage, users headed to Twitter, even quickly making the hashtag #facebookdown the top trending topic in the United States.

Downdetector.com, which monitors websites, showed the company experiencing issues across a large portion of the U.S. and Europe in addition to reported problems in certain areas of South America, Asia and Australia.

It is not immediately clear what caused Wednesday's problem.

Some users reported seeing a message saying the site was down for “required maintenance.”

Others were able to get the social networks to briefly load before discovering that its functionality was limited.

“We're aware that some people are currently having trouble accessing the Facebook family of apps,” a Facebook spokesperson said in a statement provided to USA TODAY.

“We're working to resolve the issue as soon as possible.”

In a tweet at 3:03 p.m. EDT on Wednesday the company reiterated that it is still working on a fix.

Facebook also confirmed that the outage was not the result of any distributed denial of service, or DDoS, attack.

Facebook-owned WhatsApp did not appear to be immediately affected by the outage.




