

Kansas football coach Lance Leipold couldn't help but smile at the post-practice media session on Tuesday. After all, KU's spring

started that day. KU and newcomer Houston are the only Big 12 schools to start

spring practices this early. "There's a lot going out there, that's for sure," Leipold said. "It's great to be back out there

Last season, the Jayhawks (6-7, 3-6 Big 12)
went to the Liberty Bowl
— their first bowl appearance since 2008. KU lost
55-53 in triple-overtime to
Arkansas at Simmons
Bank Liberty Stadium.
Leipold has high expectations for his team over

he's paying particular
attention to a couple of

"Retention — playing in

"You can see the confi-dence and leadership take hold right away from the start. A fair amount (of) newcomers (are) jumping in and getting a feel for

During the Jayhawks' first signing period, they brought in a transfer class of 13 players, plus four early enrollees from the 2023 high school class: Calvin Clements, Surahz Buncom, Jaden Hamm and Tony Terry. Kansas' transfer class ranks No. 39 nationally (247Sports). Leipold is excited to

integrate all the newcomintegrate all the newcom-ers into the program, but he's particularly enthusi-astic about a few defen-sive additions. Between injuries to key players such as Logan and Novitsky and the new players or the roster, KU football will have plenty of competition for depth chart spots.
"I think one thing we all learned last year is what the competition did in the

spring that made guys in the program better," Lei-pold said. After a heartbreaking bowl game loss, the first practice was one step toward building a consis-tent winner with KU foot-ball. After all, Leipold has preached continuity and growth which seems to be growth, which seems to be the theme at the start of

The Chiefs followed up by tweeting a video montage celebrating Clark's time in Kansas

City. The tributes to Clark

didn't stop there, as Chiefs general manager Brett Veach and Chiefs coach Andy Reid issued statements on Clark's

"It's really hard to put into words what Frank has meant to our organization sons," Veach said in a statement. "When we traded for him before the 2019 season, he came here with the goal of winning championships.

"We went to three Super Bowls in four seasons and

there is no doubt that Frank was a significant part of bringing those Lombardi Trophies to Kansas City. 'The Shark' cemented his legacy here in Chiefs Kingdom with his play and his personality. These decisions are never easy, but we wish him the best as he continues his career.

Reid echoed those comments.

ments.

"Frank is a special player and person," Reid said in a statement. "You were

able to see his play on the field, but if you talk to him, you realize how in-credible his heart is. Frank gave us all his energy, he invested time in our younger players to help them grow, and it just shows you how passiona he is about the game.

"He'll always be a part of our history here and we appreciate the work he put in to help us get there." While the 29-year-old

Clark played a large role in helping the Chiefs become an NFL juggernaut over the past four seasons, his release showed the business side of football. By cutting ties with

Clark, who was set to earn a \$20.5 million base salary in 2023, the Chiefs saved an estimated \$21 million against the salary cap

ahead of the start of free

ahead of the start of free agency on March 15. With Clark's release, the Chiefs now have a project-ed \$17.8 million in spend-ing money when the NFL's new calendar year begins next week, according to spotrac.

spotrac. Clark, whom the Chiefs with the Seattle Seahawks finished his time in Kansas City appearing in 58 reg-ular-season games with 55 starts, totaling 88 tackles, 23.5 sacks and 59 quarter back hits.

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

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

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

Smith breaks down talking about Willock

INDIANAPOLIS - Former Georgia linebacker Nolan Smith was a font of enthusiasm and effervescence Wednesday morning at the NFL's annual scout-ing combine, gushing about his Bull-dogs teammates and his own prospects as a potential first-round draft pick.

But it only took one question to completely change his demeanor and reduce him to tears.

"This is the first time I'm talking about it," Smith said when asked about the fatal car crash that killed Georgia teammate Devin Willock just days after

the Dawgs won their second consecu-tive national championship.

"That's my guy," Smith said, his lip quivering. "I get sensitive talking about quivering. 1 get sensitive taiking about it just because I love him. And he never did anything wrong in his three years. He was supposed to graduate. Most people don't know his brother passed like that.

"No one should deserve to die like that."

Georgia recruiting staffer Chandler LeCroy was also killed in the Jan. 15 ac-cident.

Later in the morning, following Smith's interview, new details about Willock's death emerged. The Athens-Clarke County Police Department issued an arrest warrant for former Georgia defensive lineman Jalen Carter, con sidered a potential No. 1 pick in the up-coming draft, in connection with its in-vestigation into the incident. Police said in a news release that they

are seeking to arrest Carter for reckless driving and racing. Carter and LeCroy were "operating their vehicles in a man-ner consistent with racing" prior to the crash, police said.

Smith, who's been preparing for the smith, who s been preparing for the draft and recovering from a torn pectoral muscle that truncated his 2022 season, has not returned to Athens since Georgia dismantled TCU 65-7 on Jan. 9 to win the College Football Playoff. And to win the College Football Playoff. And it was apparent his focus had helped him compartmentalize the grief. Until Wednesday. "Three years in a row, that man showed up (and) worked day in and day

snowed up (and) worked day in and day out. He's a two-time natty champ, man. And it's written in stone," Smith added, pounding his podium for emphasis and removing his glasses as the tears streamed down his face.

"Devin, I love you, baby. Seven-seven (Willock wore jersey No. 77), you living forever. 'Do it for Dev,' that's what I tell them boys at Georgia. 'You lost a brother. Do it for Dev.' I'm sorry to get emotional, man.

Smith was also asked about Carter's character, though not in the context of Willock's death. Man, I just want to go anead and clear this up right now to y'all – J.C. is just misunderstood. He's probably one of my favorite teammates to play with. "I love pass rushing with him. I just

"I love pass rushing with him. I just (love) being around him in the locker room. He's just an amazing friend." For the balance of Smith's interview, he touted his other draft-eligible team-mates and proclaimed himself largely recovered from the chest injury that he suffered in a 42-20 defeat of Florida on

Though he only had 12 ½ sacks in four seasons, the 6-3, 235-pound Smith relishes the occasional comparison to Bufisnes the occasional companson to Burfalo Bills pass rusher Von Miller and tries to pattern his game after him. Smith plans to do all the on-field drills Thursday and will also run the 40-yard dash but will not do the bench press.

"I play football," he said. "I haven't done anything in a long time. I can't wait to showcase my talents." But Willock will doubtless be on his

"Most people think it's just a game man – those are my brothers I go out there with," Smith said. "It's more than a game ... but, especially at Georgia, man, that connection piece is real."

New details emerge from ex-Georgia QB's arrest

ATHENS, Ga. - Two city of Dallas po-ATHENS, va. – Two city of Dalias po-lice officers found former Georgia quar-terback Stetson Bennett walking around a gated area near downtown and the arts district when they responded at about 6:15 a.m. on Jan. 29 to a suspicious person call at a townhome on the morning he was arrested for public intoxicatio

Bennett, who led Georgia to back-toback national championships the past two seasons, was observed "walking

further back in the gated area to hide behind a brick wall by a random (apartment) in attempt to possibly avoid (the ar-resting officers) detec-tion," according to the po-lice incident report re-eased to the Athens Banner-Herald on

On the day of the arrest, Dallas Police said they responded to reports of a man banging on doors.

The request for the incident report was made on the day Bennett was ar-rested and charged with public intoxica-

tion but it was made public during the same week that he is among more than 300 prospects who will take part in the NFL scouting combine in Indianapolis. Bennett was in Dallas to train for the

Bennett was in Dalias to train for the combine where pro teams meet with NFL hopefuls and watch them work out. According to the report, the officers announced themselves multiple times as Dallas police and called for Bennett to come from behind the wall with his come from behind the wall with his hands visible. He complied and was placed in handcuffs due to Bennett at-tempting to hide from the officers. Bennett identified himself and was unable to call his friend who police said

he claimed lived at the location. He was unable to provide his friend's address. Bennett did not have a cellphone on himself to call his friend, the report said.

He was observed with a strong odor of alcohol from his "breath and/or body," police said, and "if not arrested, could have potentially become a victim of a

A Dallas police sergeant responded to the call location due to the "high pro-file arrest." The incident occurred at 3:13 a.m., according to the report. Police said Bennett entered a "sobering center" so the charge was classified as diversion public intoxication.

As the dust settles on this deal, let's break down the details of the Kane trade and give out grades to both the Rangers and Blackhawks.



And yet the specter of Kane's past will sour this deal for many Rangers fans. In 2015, Kane was accused of sexual assault and rape by a 21-year-old woman. Kane ultimately did not face criminal charges.

Until Tuesday, Kane was a lifelong Blackhawk, with 16 seasons and three Stanley Cups under his belt. Now, he'll look to chase another one with New

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Ravens-Jackson stalemate getting risky

All it might take is one NFL owner willing and able to bet the house on La-mar Jackson. Just one and the magnificently unconventional Baltimore Ray ens quarterback could force the team's hand on whether to retain him at top dollar or watch him leave. In another place and time, Jimmy

Haslam could have been that guy. But the Cleveland Browns owner, whose fingerprints are inadvertently on the mess that has festered to the point that on Tuesday the Ravens slapped the nonexclusive franchise tag on Jackson, already has his market-setting quarter-back in Deshaun Watson.

Hey, the embattled Dan Snyder prob-ably has the stomach for such a move that would turn up the heat on Ravens owner Steve Bisciotti ... although the owner Steve Bisciotti ... although the cash required for the type of fully guar-anteed contract it likely would take to lure Jackson might be another issue. But wouldn't that be quite the wel-come-to-D.C. gift for new coordinator

Eric Bieniemy,...and maybe, too, for a

new Commanders owner.

Arthur Blank? The Falcons brain trust has let it be known that it isn't interested in any Jackson sweepstakes with several other teams following. But with several other teams following. But let's not forget that Atlanta was going to stick with Matt Ryan last year, then ex-plored Watson – which doesn't happen without the blessing of the team owner – before Haslam blew away the competition with the five-year, \$230 million

guarantee.

If you're Panthers owner David Tepper, landing a proven playmaker would be a surefire way to inject relevance into the franchise that may or may not come with a yet-to-be-proven hotshot rookie quarterback.

Miami? If Stephen Ross flirted with
Tom Brady, then you'd think that he
could also envision the possibilities of pairing Jackson with his creative coach.

be interested in Brady (now retired, by
the way), can't be counted out. Can he'? I
mean, his late father, Al, had a thing for making bold moves. So, that DNA asso-ciation alone can't be dismissed.

The owners, much more so than the coaches and GMs, loom as the real players in the drama that will determine whether Jackson has played his last down as a Raven.

Own as a Raven.

Perhaps Bisciotti and the Ravens are playing the calculated risk that no other team would dare pony up to the point that would force Baltimore to make a decision on whether to match an offer decision on whether to match an offer sheet. Equaling one, however, might be difficult given that the Ravens are cur-rently more than \$9 million over the sal-ary cap, according to OverTheCap. If no offers come, well, NFL Players

Association chief DeMaurice Smith

might have a fresh case to take up on the total action of team or

Sure, any given GM might loathe the idea of blowing up his salary-cap ledger and parting with the two first-round picks needed to come with an offer sheet for Jackson (which the Ravens could match). Yet this rises to the level of owners, who won't be fired and have a perspective that includes brand value

and cash.

Remember Bisciotti's reaction to Watson's deal last year? He knew that the full guarantee would shake up the landscape and make it harder to sign Jackson. And here we are.

The Ravens are willing to roll the dice

the Ravens are willing to roll the dice with their franchise quarterback – the last first-round pick, by the way, of former GM Ozzie Newsome, who remains in the house as a senior adviser.

Meanwhile, the price for quarter-

weanwhile, the price for quarter-backs keeps escalating to the point that Patrick Mahomes is quite the bargain at \$45 million per year. If Daniel Jones, the often-embattled-but-revived Giants quarterback, can be kept off the market with the four-year contract struck Tuesday for a reported \$160 million (though

well short of that in guarantees) then

well short of that in guarantees), then what does that make Jackson worth? Maybe this wedge exists as much be-cause of the principle of a fully guaran-teed contract or the structure of a deal teed contract or the structure of a deal as much as it does the market-value dollars. Although Jackson has missed 10 starts over the past two seasons due to various injuries, it's not that the Ravens haven't been fully willing to use his enormous skill as a runner to their full advantage. No doubt, Jackson, 26, can sense that risk against the backdrop of long-term security.

After all, the 2019 unanimous NFL

MVP has earned his leverage with re-sults. No. Jackson hasn't won the Super Bowl he pledged to pursue. But it's still possible. And as the recent season illustrated, without him the Ravens offense is pretty much half-empty.

is pretty much hair-empty.

At the moment, Jackson is worth
\$32.41 million for 2023 under the tag.
Had Baltimore used the exclusive tag, it
would have cost \$45.46 million.
It's fair to wonder whether a contract

would have been done if Newsome were still the GM rather than his hand-picked and groomed successor, Eric DeCosta. Last week, Ravens receiver Rashod Bateman called out DeCosta on Twitter (in a since-deleted tweet), the type of gesture that would have been seemed unfathomable if directed at New

Still, it's also fair to wonder whether Jackson's decision to not have an agent is an underlying factor in the prolonged sal muterlying factor in the protologes stalemate, regardless of the GM. Jack-son's reasoning for not having an estab-lished agent was more understandable when he came out of Louisville, given the slotting of rookie contracts. The past couple of years, though, an agent could have been contracted to the contracts. have been quite the buffer to engage in contract talks.

Now, agent or not, Jackson can hit the market and field his best offer. Poor John Harbaugh.

It's no wonder, and no shame, that It's no wonder, and no shame, that when someone asked Harbaugh last week whether he has thought about life after Jackson, he maintained, "Not very much. As little as possible, for sure."

Only now, like it or not, the contin-

gency planning might be forced.

Mike McDaniel was talking about his concussion issues and long-term health at the scouting combine while ducking queries about whether the Fins will pick up his fifth-year option in the coming weeks. Jackson, who represents himself, is a South Florida native and might make financial concessions to come make inflancial contessions to come home ... assuming there's mutual inter-est, which would also require the Dol-phins – currently projected nearly \$18 million overspent for 2023, accord-ing to OvertheCap – to do serious roster restructuring. With no first-round pick this year, Miami also would have to do maneuvering to make a play for Jackson, as the team cannot currently sign him to an offer sheet.

• Jets: As of Tuesday, it appears

they're firmly focused on Plan A; Aaron Rodgers. He is hardly in the bag, and if the Jets can't land him – and NYJ GM Joe Douglas said at the combine that his team will pursue a veteran passer -Jackson could be the alternative. Doug-Jackson coud be the alternative. Doug-las would also have cap work to do but could free up a nice hunk of change by releasing veteran wide receiver Corey Davis and/or pass rusher Carl Lawson.

• Texans: They've needed a quarter-

back since the falling out with former face of the franchise Deshaun Watson and have the plentiful cap room to give Jackson the deal he wants – and, per re-ports, that's something in excess of the fully guaranteed five-year, \$230 million deal the Cleveland Browns awarded

Watson last year. All that said, the Texans also own the No. 2 pick of the draft and would have to weigh whatever their and would nave to weigh whatever their interest in Jackson might be against their impressions of Bryce Young, C.J. Stroud, Anthony Richardson and Will Levis – and GM Nick Caserio and Co. are obviously guaranteed to get one of those

obviously guaranteed to get one of those players by simply standing pat.

• Colts: On some level, their situation loosely mirrors division rival Houston's given Indy is selecting fourth overall in the draft and would be guaranteed one of this year's hot passing prospects one or this year s not passing prospects by merely sticking and picking. The vet-eran quarterback route also hasn't paid off for GM Chris Ballard in the four years following Andrew Luck's shocking re-tirement. Yet it seems owner Jim Irsay heeline. He it seems owher Jill has yellow has become increasingly impatient, and Ballard may have to at least explore loosening the purse strings and spending the high-end draft expenditure for Jackson – behavior that would out against his previous approach.
