



matches the 2005 team for the worst 30-game start in franchise history.

Montreal, the frustration became not simply implied but visible and audible. Fans booed the players off the field. Twice. They chanted for manager Peter Vermes' job. Over and over again.

"It is embarrassing," Illig said. "I'm embarrassed.

"But I'm sympathetic to our own situation for why we're in this hole."

That last part came with an explanation repeated throughout the hour, one you've undoubtedly heard before. But I know why you're here, so let's talk about it.

Vermes.

His future. Sporting KC is not firing Vermes, but a date should be applied to that sentence, because ownership has considered a coaching change, and that consideration is not a thing of the past but rather put

aside for the moment.

Ultimately, internal discussions incorporating wide-ranging analytics have led to the same landing spot — they'd like to see Vermes guide a team absent the injuries to star players. And then evaluate the full picture.

If you've come here before, you already know what I think of the injury situation. But first the full initial response from Illig:

"I agree with all of the fans' frustration, and it's unbelievably exhausting to keep talking about injuries," he said. "That frustration is only going to grow, and at some point someone's got to be in the crosshairs. But if the guy's actually really frickin' good at his job, and he doesn't have the tools in his toolbox, that's not a fair evaluation."

While the statistics do supply some merit — there is a history of this team, led by this coach, producing results with the full complement of the roster — that reasoning runs counter to the past notion that Sporting KC was a club bigger than one or two players. I've pointed that out in past writing, though when I pointed it out to Illig, he noted that striker Alan Pulido's \$8 million transfer fee and midfielder Gadi Kinda's \$4 million fee dwarf what the club has paid on all of its other transfers combined. Not all absences are created equally, in other words.

Point taken.

But even so, if those two absences supply a valid excuse for not being at the top of the standings, they don't warrant being at the very bottom. It would be an oversight to think that injuries are the only culprit in the record. At the very least, we can factually say that Sporting has not responded well to its situation. That's why they're here. And that's why we're here, having an uncomfortable conversation.

But what's most relevant now is that excuse is gone, with Pulido and Gadi back in the lineup as of last weekend. And therefore, yes, that places in the crosshairs those who continue to use injuries as a rationale. The evaluation must change considerably.

Nobody involved, at least nobody to whom I've spoken, disagrees with that. Not Vermes. And

certainly not Illig. "This is a results-oriented business. The results are not up to standard," Illig said. "But we know why that is. And in the event Peter demonstrates he cannot deliver results with a full toolbox, we have no problem making a change there. And he knows that."

We're going to delve deeper into that, but let's take a step back and recognize the uniqueness of what Illig said.

One of the owners of a professional sports team is publicizing that a coach is

essentially on the hot seat. Those are my words and my phrasing, but it's not my assumption.

The longest-tenured manager in Major League Soccer is coaching under a scrutiny he's never before experienced, particularly now that he's managing with a full deck again. While that's often the case in sports, it's quite infrequent that the world knows about it.

That's not news to him. "We've had some tough conversations about the trials and tribulations of where we are," Illig said. "He's been the driver of those conversations, like, 'Listen, I know it's not good enough. You gotta do what you gotta do, but I'm not giving up."

The response: "OK, we're not (giving up), either," Illig said.

Don't mistake that for tolerance. The stretch has not only tested ownership patience but worn it nearly thin, injuries or not.

Sporting is 12-23-10 over the past two seasons. The record is abysmal. You don't need me to tell you that.

But Vermes isn't a coach whose resume is strictly the struggles of the past 15 months. He is a coach who has delivered four trophies (one MLS Cup, three U.S. Open Cups) and guided the club to eight consecutive playoff appearances ... and then struggled over the past 15 months. That often seems to be lost in the conversation, and lost in the "Vermes Out" chants. But I digress. Or then again, maybe I don't.

The point is if the leash seems long, well, he's earned one. Let's not compare it to the Chicago Fire canning their coach after less than two seasons.

Sporting's task is to address whether the guy who has been the right man in the past, which should be without debate, is the right man for the future, which has been debated within their own walls. The track record is enough to buy some time, but not eternity.

They want that answer to be yes, by the way. It's not as though ownership is waiting on him to fail. The decision to stick with Vermes derives from the hope, and the belief, that he is capable of steering the ship north.

It's a fine line between hope and belief, isn't it? That belief comes from that aforementioned track record — but maybe too from the hope it would follow the most optimal outcome.

The truth is an in-season change would not be immediately fruitful, other than perhaps being emblematic of a point Illig wants to illustrate: that the ownership group has not altered its standard. (It's harder to illustrate that point when the guy currently buried in the hole is the guy you're hoping can dig you out of it — just months after you signed him to a five-year contract extension).

It would be as drastic a change as any team in MLS could make to move on from Vermes, given the multitude of roles he occupies. But it does prompt the question of whether he — or anyone — *should* occupy so many jobs as the league continues to

balloon in size. A yearlong tailspin has poured water through the cracks of old concrete, illuminating the dangers of putting so much on the shoulders of a single person. Sporting splits its operation under two CEOs — Reid on the business side, Vermes on the technical side. And for Vermes, that includes a receipt of responsibilities like player identification and acquisition, managing the team, overseeing the

academy and the second

team, and on and on and

The escape hatch, if it were to ever come to that, can be found at the end of

"So, ultimately, are we willing to walk in terms of Peter and making a change there? Would we? Well, if it gets to the point where he has a full toolbox and we're not delivering results, we have to, right?" Illig said. "But knowing that we're going to have reset on the whole strategy that we've got thousands and thousands of pages of playbook and documents on how to go to a different direction.

"Because right now, that all sits in one head."

Illig said he has not spoken to Vermes about taking away only some of his responsibilities.

For years, Sporting owners met in the same office in a quiet Kansas suburb, outlining paths toward the future, knowing they didn't have to worry about who would be in charge of implementing those plans on the technical side. In a later comment, Illig estimated it would require maybe three years to recoil the whole thing and start fresh. But that's by Sporting's own design.

Illig said other ownership groups have told him in the past they are envious of Sporting's position, given their own disconnect and constant disagreement between technical directors and head coaches.

That all works when things are going well. But couldn't some disagreement and debate be healthy at a time like this?

"Sure, absolutely," Illig replied. "It can be." Recently, he did seek other opinions: Those of

the players. Illig said he spoke to several privately, unscheduled, and asked them

about Vermes. "They're adamant that it's not about the guy who's at the helm," Illig

said. And the players are still confident in him?

We closed like this: What does ownership want to see over the remainder of the season to keep everyone in place?

"It's going to sound simple, but results," Illig said, before pointing at a screen in front of him, showing Johnny Russell and Daniel Salloi celebrating a goal. "That face right there — seeing guys have fun, enjoying them-

selves out there. "And getting results."

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

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

Family of dead bride: Don't drive drunk

Miller died while still wearing wedding dress

COLUMBIA, S.C. – The mother of the bride had just unwound with a change of clothes and a glass of wine on her short-term rental's balcony when the sound of sirens gave the first impression that her daughter's wedding night had gone awry. Within minutes, Lisa Miller was rid-

Within minutes, Lisa Miller was rid-ing with her new in-laws to the South Carolina beach road where authorities say a woman driving under the influ-ence at twice the speed limit slammed into the golf cart escorting a happy cou-ple away from their sparkler-filled good-bye at a reception overlooking the At-lantic shoreline.

"She was around all her people. And her face was just lit up like – I don't know how to describe it," Lisa Miller said of her daughter. "This light coming

said of her daughter. "This light coming off her face, she was just so happy."

A day that had begun blissfully with charcuterie and mimosas along the beach ended with hours spent in agony outside a hospital where she had wrongly been told her daughter had been taken. Then, Lisa Miller said she learned that the bride's father had identified the hedy back at the cash site. tified the body back at the crash site. Samantha Miller, 34, died Friday in

Samantha Miller, 34, died Friday in Folly Beach, South Carolina, while still wearing her wedding dress. The groom, Aric Hutchinson, is recovering from a brain injury and numerous broken bones after the golf cart was thrown 100 yards. Two other occupants also reportedly suffered injuries of varying se-

At the wedding reception, Samantha At the wedding reception, Samantha Miller had asked the DJ to make a surprise announcement for a dance with "the most important person in the bride's life." Mom and daughter were soon dancing to "Just the Way You Are" by Bruno Mars.
That act emblematized the Charlotte.

That act emblematized the Charlotte, North Carolina, native's positive nature, her mother said. "She never met a stranger. She want-ed to make sure that everybody was tak-en care of. She doesn't ever want any-

body to be sad or mad," Lisa Miller said.
"Sam doesn't want this to destroy our lives. We know that."

She and her daughter, Mandi Jen-

She pointed inebriated ride seekers towards apps like Uber or Lyft. Jamie Komoroski, 25, has been charged with reckless vehicular homicides of the control of

cide and three counts of driving under cide and three counts of cirving under the influence causing death or great bodily injury. She told the responding officer that she had consumed one beer and a drink with tequila about an hour before the crash, according to an affida-vit obtained by The Associated Press.

She grew uncooperative after refusing to complete a sobriety test, according to the affidavit, and the officer had to help her stand. The officer then reported getting a warrant for two vials of blood after she refused to provide a breath sample at the station.

FSU, Clemson look strongest after spring

The seismic shifts rippling through college football haven't reached the Atlantic Coast Conference so far as its membership lineup is concerned. But there are changes afoot in the ACC nonetheless as the 2023 season ap-

proaches.
For one thing, the Atlantic and Coastal divisions are no more. But beyond that structural alteration, a changing of the guard on the field might be in the offing as well

Ing as wen.

In the end, it might indeed be Clemson raising the championship trophy again, but the Tigers' grip has loosened a bit in recent years. But if the door is in-

bit in recent years. But it the door is in-deed ajar, is anyone else positioned to barge through it?

With spring practice wrapped up, here's a look at how we think the confer-ence stacks up with the biggest question for each team.

1. Florida State

Will the offensive line hold up?

The biggest reason for the program's decline prior to last season was a leaky front that couldn't open holes or prevent quarterbacks from getting pounded. That unit appears to be a lot deeper now, and with incumbent quarterback Jor dan Travis and receiver Kentron Poitier ready to shine next to star Johnny Wilson. The Seminoles will look to hit the ground running and avoid the early skid that effectively eliminated them from the championship picture in 2022.

2. Clemson

Where will the big passing plays come

The defense should be fine as usual, and the running but the Tigers might need to hit the por-tal for some long pass catchers to make first-year coordinator Garrett Riley's offense truly hum.

Who will replace Israel Abanikanda's ground production?

It will likely be running back by committee for the Panthers with Abanikanda off to the NFL after a phenomenal 4,431-yard, 20-touchdown season. Boston College transfer Phil Jurkovec will enter fall camp as the favorite to take over at quarterback and should improve the passing game if he can stay healthy.

5. Wake Forest

6. North Carolina

more pressure? The Tar Heels recorded just 17 sacks in 2022, a major reason the team stum-bled down the stretch despite earning a spot in the ACC championship game. Mack Brown liked what he saw from the group in the spring, especially from vet-eran tackle Kevin Hester, but the team figures to turn to the portal to build more

7. Miami

Will the passing game have more pop? The Miami aerial attack didn't exactly scare anyone in 2022, and new coordinator Shannon Dawson wants to change that with more deep shots. Returning quarterback Tyler Van Dyke has some weapons, but keeping him upright could be a concern for an offensive line that was short-handed with injuries in

Can the Blue Devils continue their positive momentum? Year 1 under coach Mike Elko was an

unqualified success as Duke made it back to a bowl and won nine games for the first time since 2014. There will be no the first time since 2014. There will be no soft launch in 2023 with an opening night visit from Clemson on the docket, but the vibes coming out of spring drills were definitely positive, culminating with solid performances from incumbent quarterback Riley Leonard and defensive lineman R.J. Oben in the final serimmane.

9. Louisville

Will Jeff Brohm's return re-energize the fans? The timing was finally right for the

former Cardinals star quarterback to come home to assume the coaching reins after his successful run in revital-izing Purdue and Louisville fans not thrilled with predecessor Scott Satter-field. The defense figures to be ahead of the offense early on, but well-traveled quarterback Jack Plummer knows Brohm's system from his time at Purdue before his stint at California.

NCAA sets new benefits for Division I athletes

The NCAA Division I board of directors last week unanimously voted to require schools to provide a series of new benefits for college athletes that inbenefits for college athletes that in-cludes enhanced health-care coverage and funding for completion of under-graduate degrees after their playing ca-reers end, the association announced. The changes, set to take effect in Au-

The changes, set to take elect in Au-gust 2024, are among those recom-mended in January by a transformation committee that had been charged with a wide-ranging examination of the future of major college sports.

The April 26 vote comes against the backdrop of the NCAA's ongoing efforts

to persuade Congress to pass legislation to persuate conjects to plass rejustation that would provide a national standard for athletes' name image and likeness activities and give it protection from lawsuits connected to its limits on athlete compensation.

The association's progress toward the new beautiful here is beautiful here.

The association's progress toward the new benefits have been touted by NCAA executives, including new presi-dent Charlie Baker, and top school and conference administrators as evidence of the association's willingness to continue making enhancements for athletes that have been demanded by some

letes that have been demanded by some members of Congress. The vote received praise from one House member, who also said more needs to be done. A Senate aide, who spoke on the condition of anonymity

because legislative proposals are con-

inuing to be developed, also applauded the NCAA, but in a qualified way. "Today's vote is a substantial step in the right direction," said a tweet from Rep. Lori Trahan, D-Mass., who previously has offered bills regarding multi-ple areas of college sports. "Scholarship protections, covering medical ex-penses, better mental health care, and programming designed to support suc-cess after college are basic things that current and former athletes have want-

"We have a lot of work ahead to ensure the system of college athletics works for the athletes that power it. It's my hope that this unanimous vote sig-nals a new day for the NCAA under Governor Baker's leadership - one focused on working with athletes to achieve that

Baker served as Massachusetts' gov ernor before moving into his current job on March 1.

The Senate aide told USA TODAY The Senate aide told USA TODAY Sports via email: "These changes are encouraging but long overdue – college sports reform voices in Congress have long called for real health and safety protections for college athletes, scholar-

ship protections, and medical coverage "The NCAA should focus more on implementing these changes and further supporting the real needs of college ath-letes, with full input from athletes along the way, instead of lobbying Congress to pull back their rights.'

reporters. "I could see already. So I alady knew that, but he's slower than I
